Summary Highlights of Economic Conditions in the Nonrubber Footwear Industry in the Third Calendar Quarter of 1986

U.S. production.--Preliminary data indicate that domestic production of nonrubber footwear during the third quarter of 1986 declined by 15 percent from the corresponding period of 1985 to 57 million pairs (table 1). For the first 3 quarters of 1986, production is down 12 percent to 178 million pairs.

U.S. producers' shipments.--Preliminary data indicate that producers' nonrubber footwear shipments during the third quarter of 1986 declined by 6 percent from last year's level to \$1.0 billion (table 2). Shipments so far this year are down 9 percent to \$2.6 billion.

U.S. imports.--U.S. imports of nonrubber footwear during the third quarter of 1986 increased by 8 percent in quantity and 10 percent in value over those in the year-earlier period to 235 million pairs, valued at \$1.7 billion (tables 6-8). Imports so far this year are up 12 percent in quantity and 16 percent in value to nearly 727 million pairs, valued at \$4.7 billion.

The bulk of the increased imports during the third quarter came from Taiwan and Korea, the major suppliers accounting for 48 and 21 percent, respectively, of the total quantity of imports in the quarter. Imports from Taiwan during the third quarter of 1986 totaled 112 million pairs, up 17 percent over those in the corresponding period of 1985, and those from Korea totaled 50 million pairs, up 18 percent. Imports from Brazil, the third largest supplier in terms of quantity, amounted to 30 million pairs, up 4 percent. The greatest percentage growth in imports during the third quarter occurred in shipments of essentially low-valued footwear from China, the seventh largest supplier, whose shipments increased by 51 percent to 5.4 million pairs. By contrast, significant declines were experienced in imports from the fourth, fifth, and sixth largest suppliers, Italy, Spain, and Hong Kong.

U.S. exports.--U.S. exports in the third quarter of 1986 totaled 3.3 million pairs, valued at \$32.5 million, representing a decline of less than 1 percent in quantity, but a 24 percent increase in value from those a year ago (tables 15-17). Exports to Mexico, the largest U.S. market, declined by 40 percent in quantity and 67 percent in value during the period to 805,000 pairs, valued at \$511,000. Most shipments to Mexico, however, consist of parts of footwear and unfinished footwear intended for foreign assembly and subsequent shipment back to the United States under TSUS item 807.00. Exports to Japan, the second largest market, amounted to 781,000 pairs, valued at \$10.0 million during the period, representing a gain of 1 percent in quantity and 35 percent in value.

Apparent U.S. consumption.--Preliminary data indicate that apparent consumption of nonrubber footwear in the third quarter of 1986 increased by 3 percent in both quantity and value from year-earlier levels to 288.9 million pairs, valued at \$2.7 billion (tables 1 and 2).

Ratio of imports to consumption.--Preliminary data for the third quarter of 1986 show that imports' share of the U.S. nonrubber footwear market averaged 81 percent in terms of quantity and 64 percent in terms of value. In the year-earlier period, imports accounted for 77 percent of the quantity and 60 percent of the value (tables 1 and 2).

Prices.---The Producer Price Index for footwear in the third quarter of 1986 increased by 1.4 percent over the year-earlier level, whereas the Consumer Price Index declined by 0.3 percent(table 5).

Employment and unemployment rate.---Preliminary employment data show that the total number of persons employed in the U.S. nonrubber footwear industry during the third quarter of 1986 declined by 9 percent from the corresponding period of 1985, averaging 90,500 persons (table 3). The unemployment rate in the leather and leather products industry during the third quarter of 1986 was 15.0 percent, up from 9.7 percent in the corresponding period of 1985 and 13.5 percent during the first half of 1986 (table 5). 1/

Price range trend of U.S. imports.---Approximately 54 percent of the nonrubber footwear imported during January-August 1986 had an average customs value of \$5 per pair or less. The largest single price category was the \$2.51-to-\$5 per pair range, in which 34 percent of the imports were entered. Taiwan was, by far, the largest supplier of the inexpensive footwear, accounting for 62 percent of the imports valued at \$5 or less. (table 9).

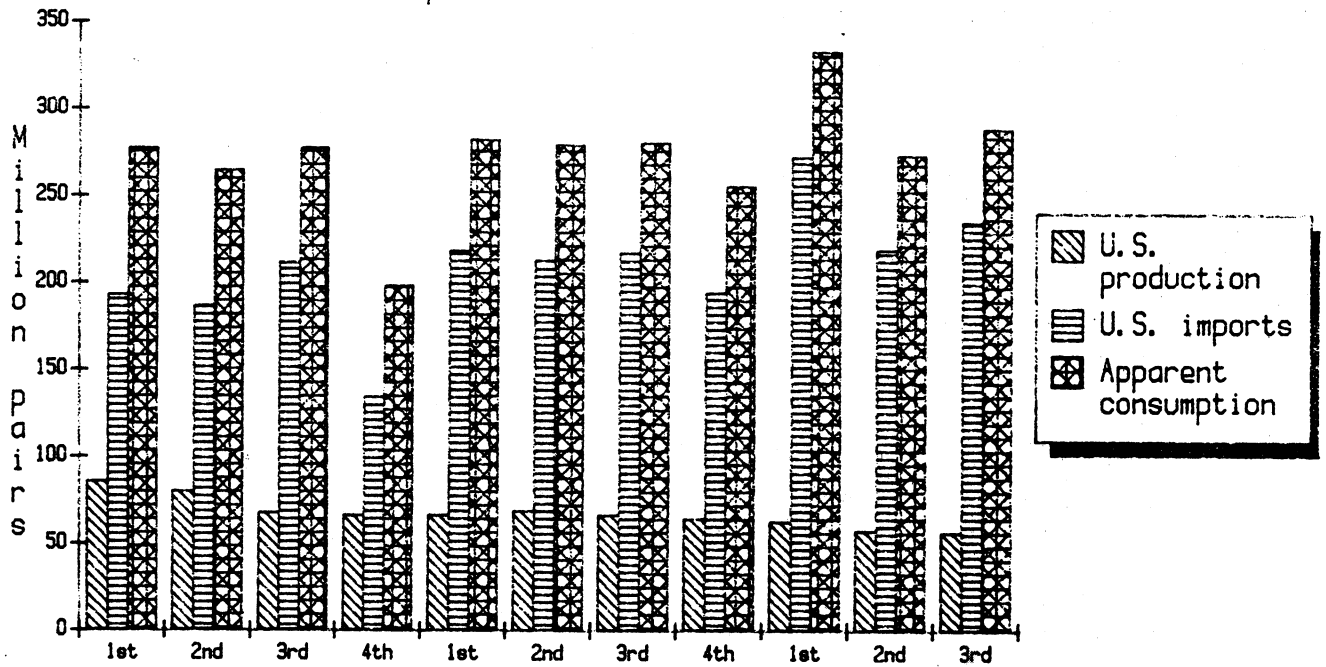
Rubber footwear.---Preliminary data indicate that during the third quarter of 1986, U.S. production of footwear with fabric uppers and soles of rubber or plastics, including sneakers, joggers, and certain casual shoes and slippers, increased by 17 percent over the corresponding period of 1985 to 15 million pairs (table 10). U.S. imports of this type of footwear increased by 23 percent during the period to 21 million pairs (tables 12-14). Consequently, imports' share of this segment of the footwear market increased by 4 percentage points during the period to 62 percent.

Preliminary data show that U.S. production of rubber and plastic protective footwear during the third quarter of 1986 increased by 42 percent over the corresponding period of 1985 to 3.2 million pairs. U.S. imports of such footwear, on the other hand, declined by 25 percent during the period to 3.7 million pairs. As a result, imports' share of this market segment decreased to 58 percent in the 1986 period from 69 percent in the 1985 period (table 11).

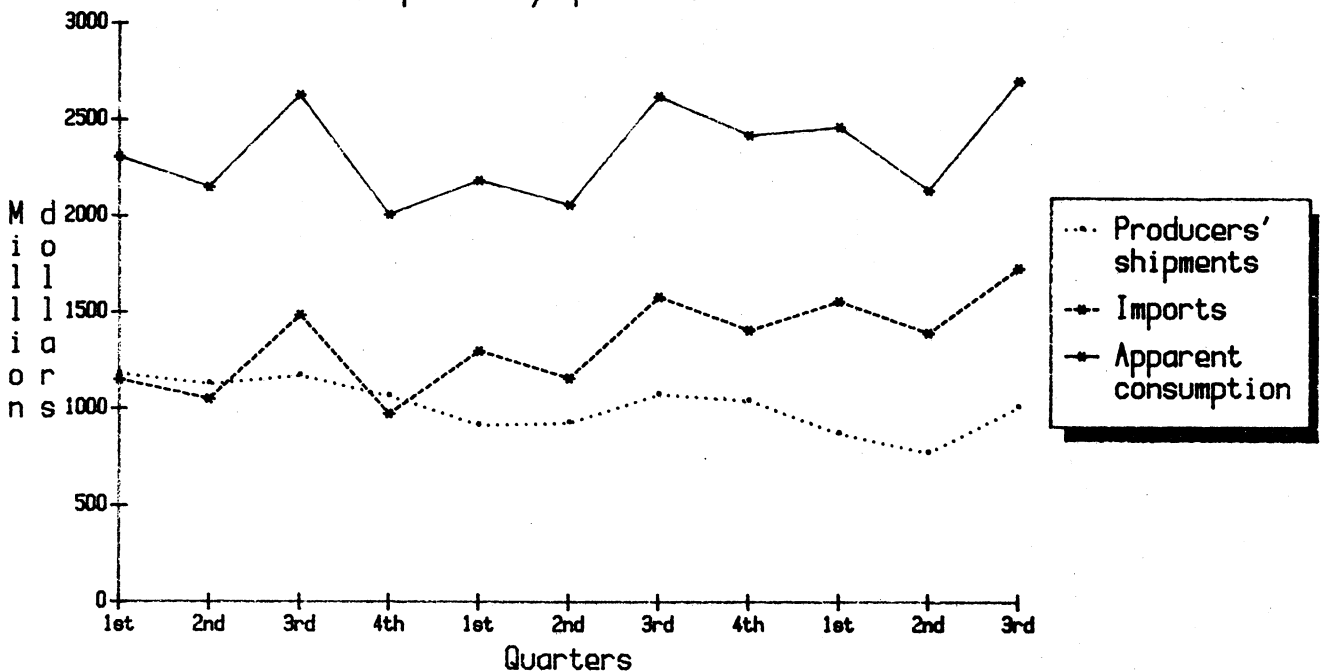

Nonrubber footwear: Quantity of U.S. production, imports for consumption, and apparent consumption, by quarters, 1984-86

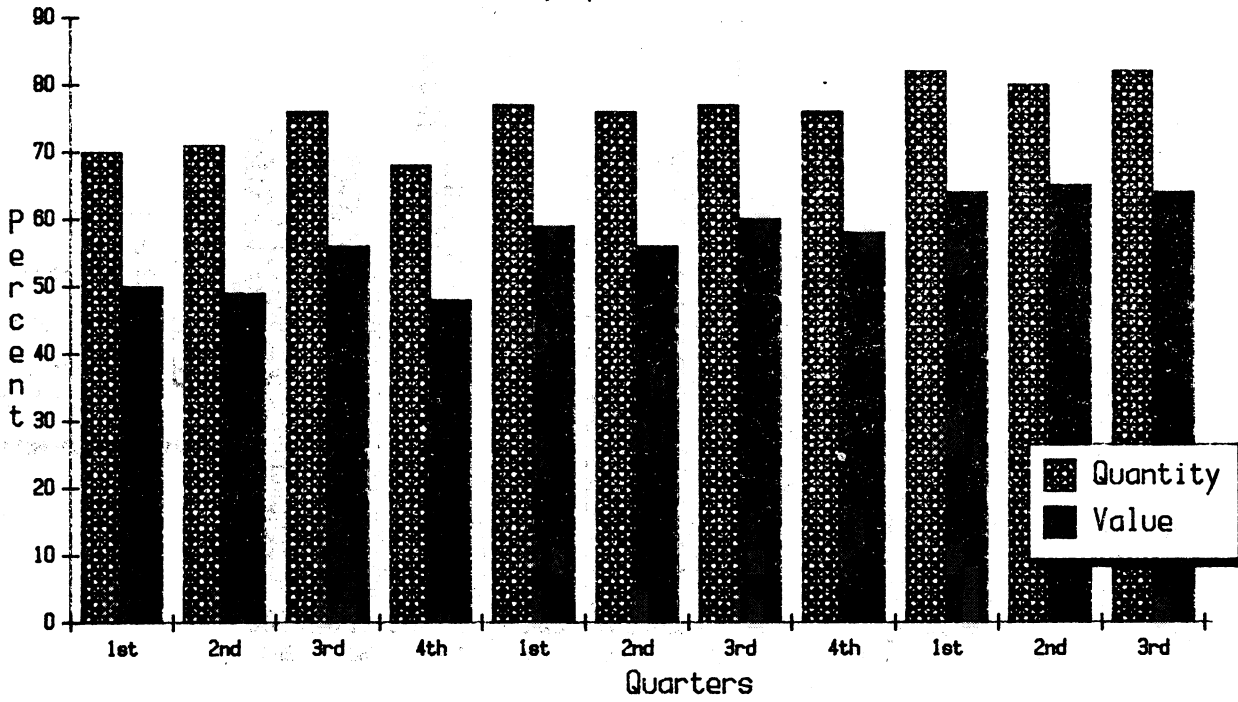


Nonrubber footwear: Value of U.S. producers' shipments, imports for consumption, and apparent consumption, by quarters, 1984-86

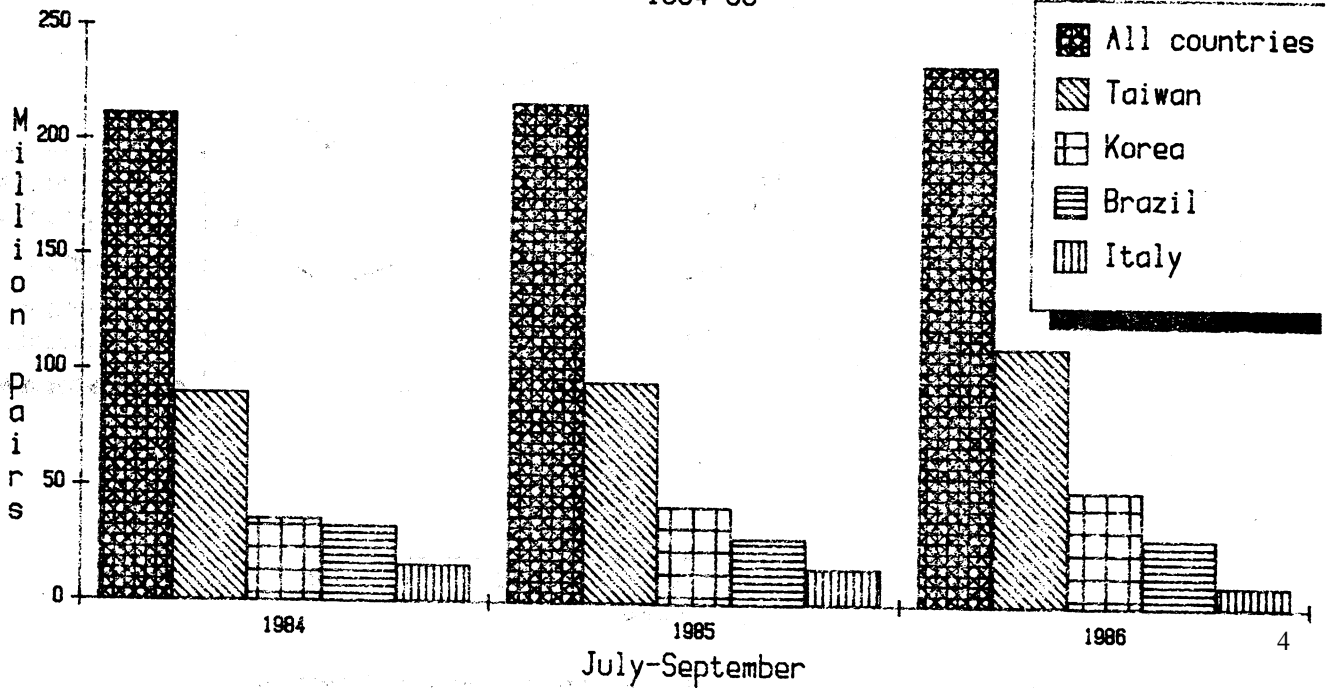

Nonrubber footwear: Ratio of Imports to consumption, by quarters, 1984-86



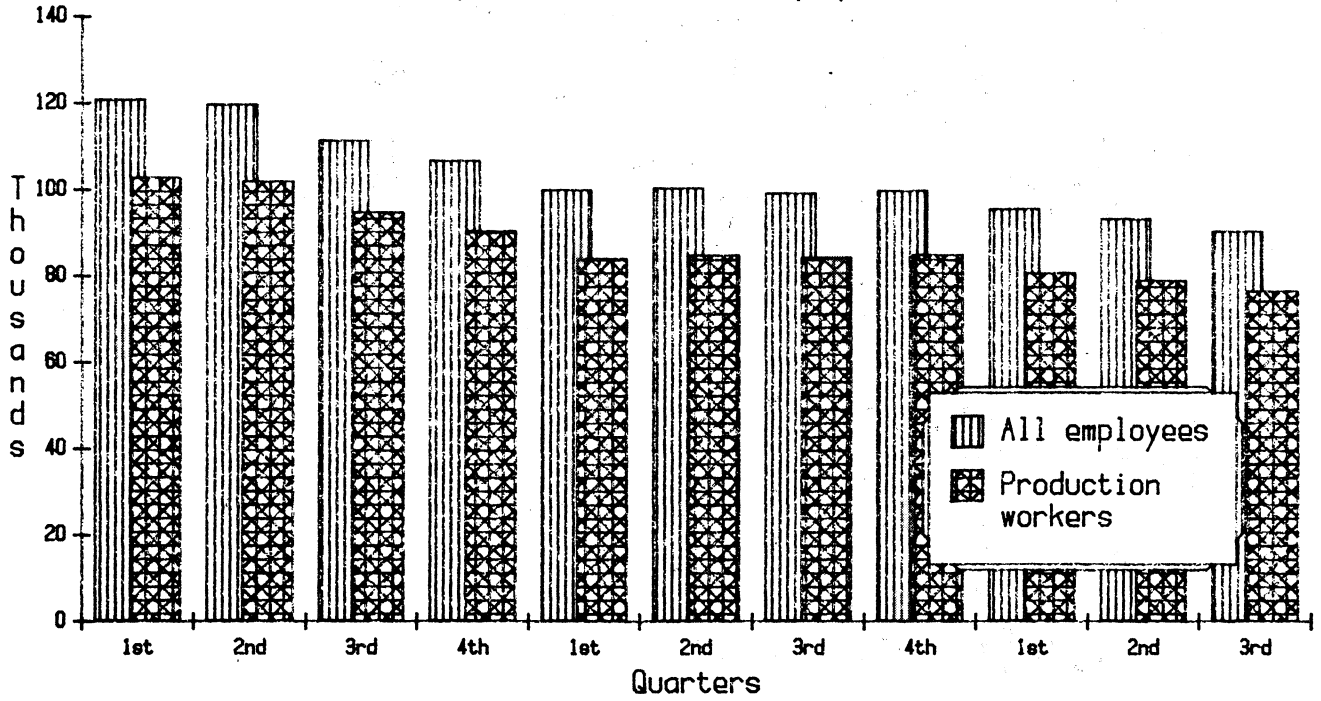
Nonrubber footwear: Quantity of U.S. imports for consumption, by principal sources, July-September 1984-86



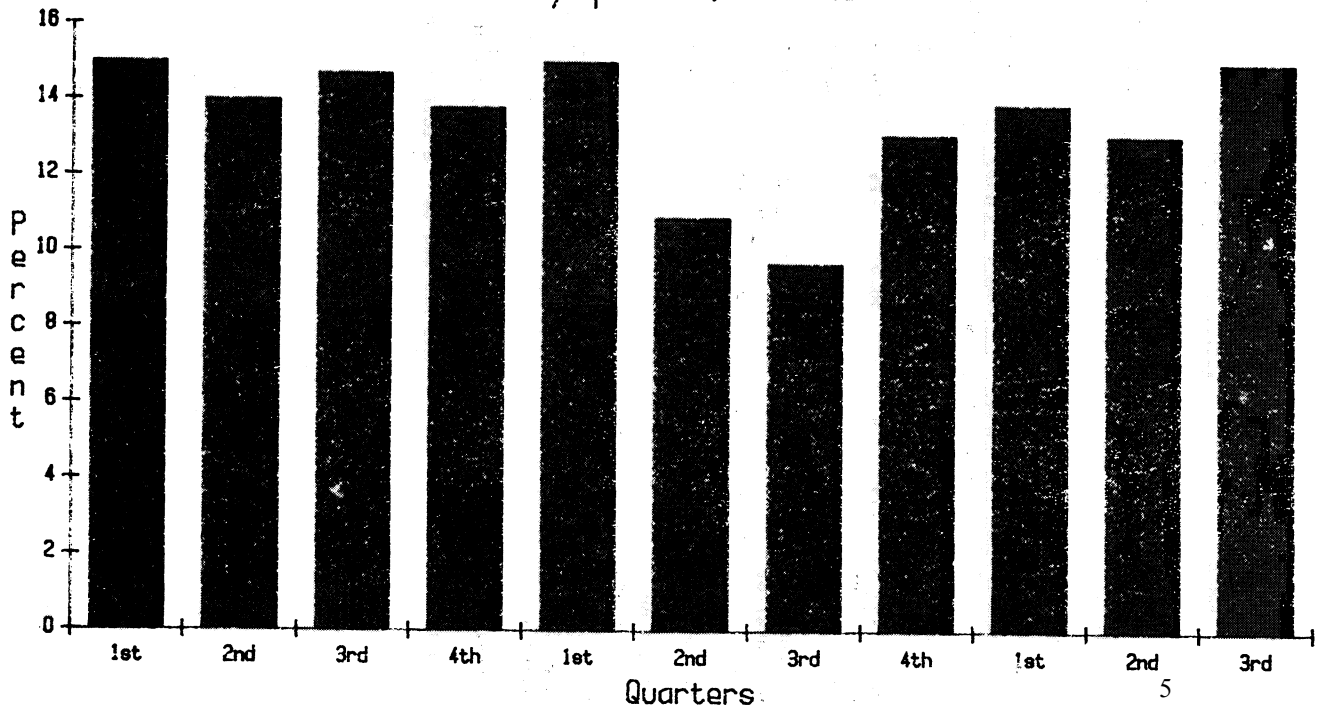
