**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DECISION NOT TO REVIEW INITIAL  
DETERMINATIONS TERMINATING INVESTIGATIONS AS TO RESPONDENTS  
CARTHUPLAS, INC. AND SCANAVO A/S**

**AGENCY:** U.S. International Trade Commission.

**ACTION:** Notice.

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review two initial determination (“IDs”) (Orders Nos. 8 and 9) issued by the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) in the above-captioned investigation granting the joint motions between complainant DuBois Limited (“DuBois”) and, respectively, respondents Carthuplas, Inc. (“Carthuplas”) and Scanavo A/S (“Scanavo”) to terminate this investigation as to those respondents based on withdrawal of the allegations against them found in the complaint.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** The Commission instituted this investigation on October 22, 2002, based on a complaint filed by DuBois against eight respondents, including Carthuplas and Scanavo. *67 Fed. Reg.* 64910. The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930 in the importation, sale for importation, or sale within the United States after importation of certain compact discs and DVD holders by reason of infringement of U.S. Design Patent No. D441,212.

On January 2, 2003, DuBois and Carthuplas filed a joint motion to terminate the

investigation as to Carthuplas based on the withdrawal of allegations against Carthuplas that are found in the complaint. Similarly, on January 24, 2003, DuBois and Scanavo filed a joint motion to terminate the investigation as to Scanavo based on the withdrawal of allegations against Scanavo that are found in the complaint. The Commission investigative attorney filed responses in support of the respective joint motions.

On March 6, 2003, the ALJ issued IDs (Orders Nos. 8 and 9) granting both joint motions. No party filed a petition for review of either ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in section 210.42 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. § 210.42).
