**ORDER**

The Commission, having reviewed a portion of the initial determination issued on June 27, 1989, in the above-captioned investigation, and having considered the issues of remedy, the public interest, and bonding has DETERMINED:

1. With regard to findings of fact concerning various non-respondents that were noticed for review, the Commission takes no position regarding the adoption or vacatur of such findings. The Commission determines that those findings do not affect the outcome of this investigation.
2. The public interest factors enumerated in section 337(d) of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, do not preclude the issuance of the remedy ordered in this investigation.

It is hereby ORDERED:

1. Strip lights that infringe claims 1, 2, 3, 4, or 7 of U.S. Letters Patent 4,376,966 are excluded from entry into the United States for the remaining term of the patent, except under license of the patent owner;
2. Packaging (whether or not such packaging contains strip lights) and literature relating to strip lights that bear U.S. Trademark Registration No. 1,433,725 for "Flex Lite", or colorable imitations thereof, are excluded from entry into the United States, except under license of the trademark owner;
3. The articles ordered to be excluded from entry into the United States according to this Order shall be entitled to entry under bond in the amount of 54 percent of the entered value of the imported articles, for the period starting on the day after this Order is received by the President pursuant to subsection (j) of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337(j)), until such time as the President notifies the Commission that he approves or disapproves this Action, but in any event, not later than 60 days after receipt of this Order by the President;

4. The Secretary shall serve copies of this Order upon each party of record in this investigation and upon the Department of Health and Human Services, the Department of Justice, the Federal Trade Commission, and the U.S. Customs Service.
5. Notice of this Order shall be published in the Federal Register.
