
**Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

P-chlorobenzaldehyde is a synthetic organic chemical intermediate used in the production of tebuconazole, one of the primary active ingredients in a series of fungicidal products produced by Bayer CropScience. This intermediate chemical is imported from Japan.

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## A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on 4-Chlorobenzaldehyde.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. 4-CHLOROBENZALDEHYDE.**

4        (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of  
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is  
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following  
7 new heading:

“	9902.05.85	4-Chlorobenzaldehyde (CAS No. 104–88–1) (provided for in subheading 2913.00.40) ..	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2008	”.
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8        (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of enactment of this Act.

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
