p-Chlorophenylglycine (CAS No. 6212-33-5) (provided for in subheading 2922.49.30).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

p-Chlorophenylglycine is an agricultural intermediate used to manufacture a termite insecticide. The proponent does not currently import the product, but it is planning to import the product starting in 2006. The most likely import sources will be England, Scotland, or Taiwan.

3 **SECTION 1. P-CHLOROPHENYLGLYCINE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
7 new heading:

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8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of enactment of this Act.

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
