Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Mixtures of 9,10-anthracenedione,1,5-dihydroxy-4-nitro-8-(phenylamino)- (CAS No. 3065-87-0) and 9,10-anthracenedione,1,8-dihydroxy-4-nitro-5-(phenylamino)-(Disperse blue 77) (CAS No. 20241-76-3) (provided for in subheading 3204.11.35)

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

This synthetic organic dyestuff, known as Disperse blue 77, is used to dye polyester fiber and fabric for use in automotive industry applications. It is imported from Switzerland and China.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.01.76 of the Har-
8 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
9 9,10-Anthracenedione, 1,5-dihydroxy-4-nitro-8-
10 (phenylamino)-and 9,10-Anthracenedione, 1,8-dihydroxy-

1 4-nitro-5-(phenylamino)-) is amended by striking “12/31/
2 2006” and inserting “12/31/2008”.

3 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
4 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
5 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
6 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
