Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject chemical is the active ingredient in formulated specialty antimicrobial products sold under several trade names, and used in products manufactured by the textile, paper, adhesives, paint and wood products industries. This chemical is imported from France. This product is registered with EPA under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA).

A BILL

To extend the suspension of duty on Copper 8-quinolinolate.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. COPPER 8-QUINOLINOLATE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.02.31 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
6 by striking “12/31/2006” and inserting “12/31/2009”.

7 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
8 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
9 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
10 the date of the enactment of this Act.
