Proponent name, location: Syngenta Crop Protection, Inc., Greensboro, NC.

Nature of bill: Temporary duty reduction through December 31, 2008.

Retroactive effect: None.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Mixtures of benzeneacetic acid, (α E)- 2-[[6-(2-cyanophenoxy)-4-pyrimidinyl]oxy]- α -(methoxymethylene)-, methyl ester (azoxystrobin) (CAS No. 131860-33-8) and application adjuvants (provided for in subheading 3808.20.15)

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product is a synthetic organic fungicide which has a chemical structure based on that of naturally occurring fungicides called strobilurins. The product is imported from the United Kingdom.

The estimated Customs revenue loss for 2007 is based on a reduction of duty from 6.5 percent ad valorem to 6.15 percent ad valorem, a reduction of 0.35 percentage points. The estimated Customs revenue loss for 2008 and 2009 is based on a reduction of duty from 6.5 percent ad valorem to 6.17 percent ad valorem, a reduction of 0.33 percentage points.

However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FORMULATIONS OF AZOXYSTROBIN.**

4 (a) CALENDAR YEAR 2006.—

5 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99
6 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United
7 States is amended by inserting in numerical se-
8 quence the following new heading:

“	9902.90.02	Formulations of Azoxystrobin which include Azoxystrobin Technical - benzeneacetic acid, 2-[[6-(2-cyanophenoxy)-4-pyrimidinyl]oxy]-alpha-(Methoxymethylene)-methyl ester,(alphaE)- (CAS No. 131860-33-8) (provided for in subheading 3808.20.15) ..	6.14%	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2006	”.
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1 (2) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made
2 by paragraph (1) applies to goods entered, or with-
3 drawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
4 the 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.

5 (b) CALENDAR YEAR 2007.—

6 (1) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.90.02 of the
7 Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States, as
8 added by subsection (a), is amended—

9 (A) by striking “6.14%” and inserting
10 “6.15%”; and

11 (B) by striking “On or before 12/31/2006”
12 and inserting “On or before 12/31/2007”.

13 (2) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made
14 by paragraph (1) shall take effect on January 1,
15 2007.

16 (c) CALENDAR YEAR 2008.—

17 (1) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.90.02 of the
18 Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States, as
19 added by subsection (a) and amended by subsection
20 (b), is further amended—

1 (A) by striking “6.15%” and inserting
2 “6.17%”; and

3 (B) by striking “On or before 12/31/2007”
4 and inserting “On or before 12/31/2008”.

5 (2) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made
6 by paragraph (1) shall take effect on January 1,
7 2008.

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
