This synthetic organic chemical is an intermediate material used in the manufacture of Rimsulfuron (EPA Reg. No. 352-555), an herbicide used on corn, potato, and tomato crops. This chemical is imported from the United Kingdom.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. 3-(ETHYLSULFONLY)-2-PYRIDINESULFONAMIDE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.33.63 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
6 by striking “12/31/2006” and inserting “12/31/2009”.

7 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
8 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of enactment of this Act.

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
