6 ((3-((Dimethylamino)carbonyl)-2-pyridinyl)sulfonyl) car-
7 bamic acid, phenyl ester) is amended by striking “12/31/
8 2006” and inserting “12/31/2009”.

9 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
10 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of enactment of this Act.

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
