The subject product is a synthetic organic intermediate used to produce the active ingredients in sulfonylurea herbicides. The end use postemergence herbicides are used for selective grass and weed control in cereal crops. The subject product is imported from China.

3 **SECTION 1. 2-METHYL-4-METHOXY-6-METHYLAMINO-1,3,5-**
4 **TRIAZINE.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
7 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
8 new heading:

“	9902.08.03	2-methyl-4-methoxy-6-methylamino-1,3,5-triazine (CAS No. 5248-39-5) (provided for in subheading 2933.69.60)	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2009	”.
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1 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
2 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
4 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
