**Nature of bill:** Extension of temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

Quinoline (CAS No. 91-22-5) (provided for in subheading 2933.49.70).

**Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

The subject product, imported from China, Japan, and Germany, is a chemical intermediate that is used in the manufacture of (among other products) Diclosulam Technical, an herbicide, which, in turn, is used in peanut crop protection.

Mr. BURTON of Indiana introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

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## A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on Quinoline.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. QUINOLINE.**

4       (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.29.61 of the Har-  
5       monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended  
6       by striking “12/31/2009” and inserting “12/31/2011”.

7       (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
8       subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or  
9       withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after  
10      the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.
