**Nature of bill:** Extension of temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

2-Chlorobenzyl chloride (CAS No. 611-19-8) (provided for in subheading 2903.69.80).

**Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is used to produce a broad-spectrum herbicide to control annual grasses and broadleaf weeds in crops. The product is also used to produce a fungicide that suppresses diseases on a variety of crops. The product is imported primarily from Belgium, Germany, and Japan.

## A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on 2-  
Chlorobenzyl chloride.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. 2-CHLOROBENZYL CHLORIDE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.01.56 of the Har-  
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to  
6 2-Chlorobenzyl chloride) is amended by striking “12/31/  
7 2009” and inserting “12/31/2011”.

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.
