**MEMORANDUM ON PROPOSED TARIFF LEGISLATION
of the 111th Congress¹**

[Date approved: February 23, 2010]²

Bill No. and sponsor: S. 1991 (Ms. Amy Klobuchar of Minnesota).

Proponent name,³ location: Target Corporation, Minneapolis, MN.

Other bills on product (111th Congress only): None.

Nature of bill: Temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

Retroactive effect: None.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Divided pouches of plastic sheeting, each with a flap closure secured by a snap, magnet or elastic band and hook, the foregoing not exceeding 203.2 mm in height, width or depth and of a type designed for organizing coupons or other printed matter (provided for in subheading 4202.32.20)

Check one: Same as that in bill as introduced.

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject products are accordion-style divided pouches made of plastic sheeting. Each one has a flap closure secured by a snap, magnet, or elastic band and hook; measures no more than 203.2 millimeters in height, width, or depth; and includes dividers to create two or more compartments, allowing the user to organize coupons or other printed matter. They are imported predominantly from China.

According to the proponent and industry contacts, the subject products are not produced domestically.

To suspend temporarily the duty on certain coupon holders.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN COUPON HOLDERS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
7 new heading:

“	9902.01.00	Accordion style file folders made of plastic material, with a flap secured by a snap, magnet or elastic band and hook closure, not exceeding 203.2 millimeters in height, width or depth, and with two or more separate pockets for organization of coupons or other contents (provided for in subheading 4202.32.20) ...
