Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product is the active ingredient in various insecticides. It provides control of key insect pests in a wide variety of crops, including apples, pears, stone fruit, tree nuts, fruiting and leafy vegetables, potatoes, and rice. The product is imported from France.
