The subject product is a chemical intermediate that is used to make organic yellow pigments for coloring printing inks. The product is imported from China, Switzerland, and Germany.

3 **SECTION 1. ACETOACET-P-ANISIDINE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.25.18 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 Acetoacet-p-Anisidine) is amended by striking the date in
7 the effective column period and inserting “12/31/2011”.

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.
