Bill No. and sponsor: S. 2315 (Mr. Sherrod Brown of Ohio et al.).

Proponent name,³ location: DuPont, Wilmington, DE.

Other bills on product (111th Congress only): None.

Nature of bill: Extension of temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.⁴

Retroactive effect: None.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

1,3-Bis(4-aminophenoxy)benzene (CAS No. 2479-46-1) (provided for in subheading 2922.29.29 or 2922.29.61).

Check one: Same as that in bill as introduced.

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is used as an intermediate in the production of a polyimide film which has a variety of uses, including electrical insulation, substrates for printed electronic circuits, and magnetic tapes. The product may also be used to make or process photographic film, in which case it would be imported under HTS subheading 2922.29.29 instead of 2922.29.61. The product is imported from Asia.

6 ule of the United States (relating to 1,3-bis(4-
7 Aminophenoxy)benzene (RODA)) is amended by striking
8 “12/31/2009” and inserting “12/31/2011”.

9 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
10 this section applies with respect to goods entered, or with-

- 1 drawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after the
- 2 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.

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
