Nature of bill: Extension of temporary duty reduction through December 31, 2011.⁴

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is used as an insecticide to control sucking insects on cotton and various other crops. The product is imported from Japan.

To extend temporarily the reduction of duty on certain
pesticide chemical.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN PESTICIDE CHEMICAL.**

4 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Heading 9902.03.92 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 certain pesticide chemical) is amended by striking the date
7 in the effective period column and inserting “12/31/2011”.

8 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

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- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
