II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Plaiting materials and products of plaiting materials, suitable for use in window shades, presented in rolls each having an area measuring 27.85 m² or more but not over 46.46 m², of bamboo reeds and/or bamboo slats each measuring 1 mm or more but not over 13 mm in width, and/or bamboo cane over 2 mm or more but not over 12 mm in cross section, the foregoing woven with polyester yarn into a repeating pattern which may also include grass, paper strips or jute (provided for in subheading 4601.92.20)

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The product is plaited window shade material composed of horizontal stems or slats of bamboo woven together using polyester yarn and imported as rolls having specified widths and lengths. The material may also incorporate grass, twisted paper strips or jute to form a decorative pattern. The subject product must be made of "plaiting materials" as defined in chapter 46, note 1, in order to be classified in heading 4601. The imported rolled material is then cut to desired widths and lengths to be manufactured into window shades typically sold as "woven natural fiber" shade styles. Manufacturing consists of cutting the rolls to specified sizes and adding the necessary hardware such as head and bottom rails, pulleys or other mechanical fittings and a lift cord.

There are no known domestic manufacturers of bamboo window shade material. The fabrication of these materials is labor intensive, so they are produced in countries with low labor costs. They are mainly imported from China and Vietnam. Window shades are sold through specialty retailers, specialty mail order vendors, custom home furnishing dealers and general merchandise retailers.

We oppose the bill as written because even though we import these materials we would be excluded from benefiting from the temporary suspension of duties because of a technicality, which is the size of the rolls being imported.

The bill as written would benefit one company in our industry to the exclusion of other such as us.

Below is the wording of the bill with suggested changes that would benefit everyone in the industry, rather than one company. The areas we would suggest removing are lined out with the suggested replacement wording in yellow.

To suspend temporarily the duty on certain window shade
material.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN WINDOW SHADE MATERIAL.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
7 new heading:

“	9902.01.00	Plaiting material products suitable for use in window shades, in rolls each having an area measuring over 27.85 m ² but less than 46.46 m ² , of bamboo reeds and/or bamboo slats each measuring over 1 mm or more but not greater than 13 mm in width, and/or bamboo cane over 2 mm or more but not greater than 12 mm in diameter, the foregoing woven with polyester yarn into a repeating pattern which may also include grass, paper strips or jute (provided for in sub-heading 4601.92.20)	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2015	”.
