Magnesium aluminum hydroxide carbonate (synthetic hydrotalcite) (CAS No. 11097-59-9) (provided for in subheading 2842.90.90); and magnesium aluminum hydroxide carbonate (synthetic hydrotalcite) (CAS No. 11097-59-9) coated with stearic acid (CAS No. 57-11-4) (provided for in subheading 3812.30.90).

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on Magnesium aluminum hydroxide carbonate hydrate.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. MAGNESIUM ALUMINUM HYDROXIDE CAR-**
4 **BONATE HYDRATE.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.05.32 of the Har-
6 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
7 Magnesium aluminum hydroxide carbonate hydrate) is
8 amended by striking “12/31/2009” and inserting “12/31/
9 2011”.

1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
2 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
4 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
