**MEMORANDUM ON PROPOSED TARIFF LEGISLATION  
of the 109<sup>th</sup> Congress<sup>1</sup>**

**Bill No. and sponsor:** S. 1659 (Mr. Rick Santorum of Pennsylvania).

**Proponent name, location:** Rohm and Haas Company, Philadelphia, PA.

**Other bills on product (109<sup>th</sup> Congress only):** H.R. 2260.

**Nature of bill:** Temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2008.

**Retroactive effect:** None.

**Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):**

Ion-exchange resins comprised of a macroporous polymer of divinylbenzene (CAS No. 9003-69-4) (provided for in subheading 3914.00.60).

**Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

The proponent imports three adsorbent resins under the trade names Amberlite® XAD4, XAD16, and XAD16HP. These insoluble white translucent beads are un-functionalized macroporous polymers of diethenylbenzene (CAS No. 9003-69-4). These products were developed for a wide range of applications where removal or isolation of organic compounds is desired. Typical examples are separation and purification of antibiotics, vitamins, steroids and enzymes in the pharmaceutical and chemical industries; removal of organic pollutants from aqueous waste or ground water; removal of solvents, herbicides and pesticides from aqueous streams; and recovery of organic compounds for subsequent identification and analysis in chemical or clinical analysis. A major use of Amberlite®XAD4 is for the in situ removal of antibodies from blood culture media. These adsorbent resins have FDA clearance for the removal of organic substances from certain aqueous food streams. The subject product is imported from France.

To suspend temporarily the duty on a certain chemical.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF DUTY ON A CERTAIN CHEM-**  
4 **ICAL.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of  
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is  
7 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following  
8 new heading:

“	9902.39.09	Adsorbent resin comprised of a macroporous polymer of diethenylbenzene, (CAS No. 9003–69–4) (provided for in subheading 3911.90.90) .....	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2008	”.
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1       (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
2 subsection (a) applies to articles entered, or withdrawn  
3 from warehouse for consumption, on or after the date of  
4 the enactment of this Act.

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
