13 701-TA-451 and 731-TA-1126-1128 (Preliminary) Certain
14 Lightweight Thermal Paper from China, Germany, and
15 Korea.

16 Welcome to Mr. Mazur and the staff who
17 participated in these investigations. Are there any
18 questions for the staff? Are there any additions or
19 corrections to the staff report?

20 MS. MAZUR: There are no additions or
21 corrections, Mr. Chairman.

22 CHAIRMAN PEARSON: Is there any objection to
23 approval of the staff report?

12 Korea are negligible. With respect to imports from
13 China I make an affirmative determination. With
14 respect to imports from Germany I make a negative
15 determination.

17 COMMISSIONER LANE: I find imports from
18 Korea to be negligible and I find in the affirmative
19 as to imports from China and Germany.

20 MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Pearson?

21 CHAIRMAN PEARSON: I concur with
22 Commissioner Okun.

23 MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Aranoff?

24 VICE CHAIRMAN ARANOFF: I concur with
25 Chairman Pearson and Commissioner Okun.

1 MS.ABBOTT: Commissioner Pinkert?

2 COMMISSIONER PINKERT: I find that subject
3 imports from Korea are negligible. With respect to
4 China and Germany I vote in the affirmative.

5 MS. ABBOTT: Mr. Chairman, the Commission
6 has reached affirmative determinations regarding China
7 and Germany and made a negligibility finding regarding
8 Korea.

9 CHAIRMAN PEARSON: Thank you, Madam
10 Secretary.

11 Further information regarding these
12 determinations will be in the press release. The
13 Commissioners' opinions currently are scheduled to be
14 transmitted to the Department of Commerce on or before
15 December 4, 2007.
