14 respect to imports from Russia, I vote in the  
15 negative.

16                  MR. BISHOP: Commissioner Pearson.

17                  COMMISSIONER PEARSON: I vote in the  
18 affirmative with respect to the imports from China,  
19 and in the negative with respect to imports from  
20 Russia.

21                  MR. BISHOP: Commissioner Lane.

22                  COMMISSIONER LANE: I vote in the  
23 affirmative with respect to both countries.

24                  MR. BISHOP: Madame Chairman, the Commission  
25 has reached affirmative determinations with respect to

1 China, and negative determinations with respect to  
2 Russia.

3 CHAIRMAN OKUN: Thank you. Further  
4 information regarding these determinations will be in  
5 a press release. Commissioners' opinions are  
6 currently scheduled to be transmitted to the  
7 Department of Commerce on or before February 23, 2011.
