Reg. 45272 (July 26, 2013), this is the Initial Determination of the Investigation in the Matter of Certain Silicon Microphone Packages and Products Containing Same, United States International Trade Commission Investigation No. 337-TA-888. *See* 19 C.F.R. § 210.42(a).

With respect to Respondents GoerTek, Inc. and GoerTek Electronics, Inc. it is held that a violation of Section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), has occurred in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or the sale within the United States after importation, of certain silicon microphone packages and products containing same, by reason of infringement of one or more of claims 1, 2, 8, 11-12, 15-18, and 21 of United States Patent No. 7,439,616.

With respect to Respondents GoerTek, Inc. and GoerTek Electronics, Inc., it is held that a violation of Section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), has occurred in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or the sale within the United States after importation, of certain silicon microphone packages and products containing same, by reason of infringement of one or more of claims 1, 15, 16, 19, 21-23, and 25-26 of United States Patent No. 8,018,049.

With respect to Respondents GoerTek, Inc. and GoerTek Electronics, Inc., it is held that a violation of Section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), has occurred in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or the sale within the United States after importation, of certain silicon microphone packages and products containing same, by reason of infringement of one or more of claims 1, 2, 4, 5, and 11-13 of United States Patent No. 8,121,331.

It is further held that a domestic industry exists that practices U.S. Patent Nos. 7,439,616, 8,018,049, and 8,121,331.
