

Key Issues In This Review

- Price is paramount
- All seven subject countries should be cumulated
- Subject producers have massive excess and divertible capacity
- Subject producers face challenges in alternative markets
- The U.S. is an open, large, and attractively priced market
- The domestic industry is vulnerable
- Revocation will materially injure the domestic industry
