For the fourth quarter of 1979, domestic production of canned mushrooms and imports both increased compared with the same quarter a year earlier.

Meanwhile, sales by domestic producers declined in the 1979 period. During the fourth quarter of 1979, domestic production totaled 26.6 million bounds; imports, 21.4 million pounds; and sales by producers, 24.4 million pounds.

On a percentage basis, the changes between the two fourth-quarter periods for these categories amounted to increases of 3 percent and 36 percent in output and imports, respectively, and a decrease of 10 percent in sales. Apparent consumption of canned mushrooms totaled 47.1 million pounds, up percent, as imports more than offset the decline in domestic sales. U.3 producers' inventories increased 15 percent during the period october 1-December 31, 1979, compared with a 9 percent decline during october 1-December 31, 1978. Sales of frozen mushrooms, at 1.8 million pounds in the fourth quarter of 1979, were 15 percent more than in the corresponding period of 1978.

The performance of the industry in July-December 1979, compared with that in the corresponding period in 1978, was similar to that exhibited on a quarterly basis but for one exception: Production was 10 percent lower in the last half of 1979 whereas in the fourth quarter of 1979 it was 3 percent higher than in the comparable period of 1978.

Imports from all major suppliers, i.e., Taiwan, the Republic of Korea, and Hong Kong, were up substantially. Imports from Taiwan, the principal U.S. supplier, increased 25 percent, from 10.2 million pounds in the fourth quarter of 1978 to 12.7 million pounds in the fourth quarter of 1979, while imports from Korea rose 66 percent (from 2.3 million to 3.8 million pounds) and those from Hong Kong were up 48 percent (from 2.3 million to 3.4 million pounds). Taiwan's share of the U.S. import market declined from 64 percent in 1978 to

59 percent in 1979. The share of the import market held by Korea increased from 15 percent to 18 percent and that held by Hong Kong rose from 15 percent to 16 percent. The rise in imports during the fourth quarters of 1978 and 1979 is also evident during the last six months of those years.
