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**Summary Highlights of the Third Annual Survey of U.S. Producers  
and Importers of Nonrubber Footwear**

The U.S. International Trade Commission herein reports the major findings of its third annual survey on nonrubber footwear, required under Presidential Proclamation No. 4510.

Profit.--U.S. producers reported that the ratio of operating profit (before taxes) to net sales on their entire footwear operations (manufacturing, purchasing, and retailing) was 5.6 percent in 1979, compared with 5.9 percent in 1978 (table 2). The ratio for their footwear-manufacturing operations was 5.3 percent in 1979, compared with 5.7 percent in 1978 (table 3).

Prices.--Both importers' and producers' prices were higher in 1979 than in 1978. Comparisons of producers' and importers' shipments for 1977-79, by price ranges and by types, including material, are shown in tables 16-20.

U.S. producers' and importers' inventories.--From 1978 to 1979 the yearend inventories reported by U.S. producers decreased approximately 13 percent in quantity to 38.5 million pairs, but increased 13 percent in value to \$420.3 million (table 7). U.S. importers' yearend inventories decreased approximately 18 percent in quantity to 90.4 million pairs and 1 percent in value to \$912.7 million (table 8).

Industry structure.--The industry trend toward increased concentration is continuing with a relatively small number of large producers accounting for a greater share of annual production. During the period 1974-78, the largest producers (with annual production of 4 million pairs or more) increased their share of total annual production from 50 percent to 54 percent (table 13).

Survey description.--Data compiled in this survey are from responses to Commission questionnaires, except where noted, and represent approximately 87 percent of all shipments of domestically produced nonrubber footwear and 80 percent of U.S. imports in 1979. All of the largest producers and importers were included in the survey. Most of the producers and importers whose volume of shipments was less than 100,000 pairs were not included to reduce the reporting burden for such firms.

U.S. producers' and importers' unfilled orders.--U.S. producers reported unfilled orders of 70.1 million pairs on January 1, 1980, compared with 56.4 million pairs on January 1, 1979 (table 9).

U.S. importers' unfilled orders amounted to 63.3 million pairs on January 1, 1980 compared with 60.5 million pairs on January 1, 1979 (table 10).

Capacity and utilization of capacity.--U.S. producers' manufacturing capacity declined 6.3 percent from 1978 to 1979, from 553.9 million pairs to 519.4 million pairs (table 14). According to recently revised data, utilization of capacity stood at 73.4 percent in 1979, compared with 75.6 percent in 1978.

Capital expenditures and expenditures for research and development.--U.S. producers' capital expenditures increased from \$57.1 million in 1978 to \$59.3 million in 1979, or by 4 percent (table 4). Expenditures for new plants and for machinery, equipment, and fixtures showed declines, but expenditures for additions to existing plants increased by \$3.8 million, or 73 percent. Expenditures for research and development increased 38 percent, from \$9.2 million to \$12.7 million, during the same period.
