

Report to the President on Investigation 332-112 Under Section 332 of the Tariff Act of 1930

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United States International Trade Commission / Washington, D.C. 20436

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Summary of Trends

Highlights

The following are highlights of economic data collected on color television receivers for calendar year 1981. These data are compared with data reported for calendar year 1980.

- o U.S. DOMESTIC PRODUCERS of color television receivers operated at an aggregate net operating loss of \$2.3 million in 1981, compared with a net operating profit of \$67.2 million in 1980.
- o THE CAPACITY of U.S. Producers, on a one-shift basis, was 12.6 million units, representing an increase of 3.7 percent.
- o CAPITAL EXPENDITURES by U.S. producers for building and leasehold expenditures and for new machinery, equipment, and fixtures were \$98.2 million, representing an increase of 22.4 percent.
- o RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT EXPENDITURES by U.S. producers related to the production or assembly of color television receivers totaled \$74.1 million, an increase of less than 1.0 percent.
- o THE AVERAGE UNIT VALUE of imported 13-inch color television receivers sold by U.S. importers was \$244.51, representing a decrease of 8.0 percent, and that of 18- and 19-inch receivers was, \$261.92, representing a decrease of 20.2 percent.
- o ORDERS FILLED by U.S. importers for imported color television receivers amounted to 1.4 million units, representing an increase of 69.5 percent.
- o U.S. IMPORTERS' YEAREND INVENTORIES of imported color television receivers were 463,000 units, representing an increase of 400 percent.

Annual statistics

U.S. producers' operating results.--U.S. producers reported a net operating loss of \$2.3 million in 1981, compared with a net operating profit of \$67.2 million in 1980. Net operating loss was less than 0.1 percent of net sales in 1981, compared with a 1.9-percent net operating profit in 1980. Net operating profit decreased from 3.7 percent in 1976 to 1.2 percent in 1979.

U.S. producers' capacity. -- Annual capacity in 1981 rose by 3.7 percent over that in 1980. The reported one-shift industry capacity of 12.6 million sets was 20.0 percent above the industry production of 10.5 million units in 1981. Some firms started production operations or increased their capacity, while the capacity of other firms was reduced. In some cases, capacity for projection television receiver production was obtained by reducing that for regular color television receiver production. In 1976 the annual one-shift capacity was 10.3 million receivers, and this capacity increased in each succeeding year.

U.S. producers' capital expenditures.—Expenditures in 1981 by U.S. producers for building and leasehold improvements in the United States were \$15.4 million, compared with \$9.3 million in 1980, representing an increase of 66.1 percent. This was the first increase since 1978. Such expenditures outside the United States amounted to \$6.3 million in 1981, compared with \$3.1 million in 1980, representing a 100-percent increase. Purchases of new machinery, equipment, and fixtures for U.S. plants amounted to \$50.3 million in 1981, compared with \$53.0 million in 1980, representing a decrease of 4.9 percent. Such purchases for facilities outside the United States in 1981 totaled \$26.2 million in 1981, compared with \$14.9 million in 1980, representing an increase of 75.7 percent.

U.S. producers' R. & D. expenditures.—Research and development expenditures of \$74.1 million by U.S. producers in 1981 were almost the same as the \$73.8 million expended in 1980. Between 1976 and 1979, such expenses ranged between \$86.3 million and \$112.2 million.

U.S. importers' orders filled.—Importers' orders filled for imported color television receivers amounted to 1.4 million sets, compared with 819,000 sets in 1980, representing an increase of 69.5 percent. This reflects the sharp increase in orders filled for receivers with screen sizes of 17 inches and under. Such orders filled increased by 67.0 percent, and orders filled for receivers with screen sizes of 18 inches and over increased by 76.7 percent.

U.S. importers' inventories. -- Importers' inventories were higher at the end of every quarter in 1981 than at the end of every quarter in 1980. Total inventories in 1981 increased from 218,000 sets on March 31 to 463,000 on December 31.

<u>U.S. importers' unit value.</u>—Average unit values reported by U.S. importers for imported color television receivers in 1981 indicate decreases for both 13-inch and 18- and 19-inch sets, compared with those in 1980. In the 13-inch screen-size category, U.S. importers reported lower average unit prices for receivers in each quarter of 1981, compared with prices in the corresponding quarters of 1980. These decreases ranged from \$7.44 in the first quarter to \$30.16 in the second quarter. Reported 1981 prices for the 18- and 19-inch screen-size categories decreased from a minimum of \$40.22 in the second quarter to a maximum of \$107.33 in the third quarter, compared with prices in the corresponding quarters of 1980.
