Highlights

Summary of trends

The following are highlights of the economic data collected on the heavyweight motorcycle industry for the fourth quarter of 1982 (including certain annual data for 1982), the first quarter of 1983, and the second quarter of 1983. Since virtually all data obtained by the Commission regarding the domestic heavyweight motorcycle industry are business confidential (even in the aggregate), little information concerning the domestic industry is available in the public report. All U.S. import data obtained by the Commission appear in the aggregate, except for data on unfilled orders.

- o U.S. production fluctuated in a relatively narrow range during October 1982-June 1983, and shipments, exports, retail sales, and inventories followed the seasonal trends for motorcycles.
- o Employment remained relatively constant during October 1982-June 1983, averaging about 3,100 employees, hours worked by production and related workers increased during the same period.
- o Annual capacity remained relatively stable in 1982.
- o U.S. imports of heavyweight motorcycles increased from 48,145 units in October-December 1982 to 67,301 units in January-March 1983 and then declined to 21,016 units in April-June 1983.
- o Retail sales of imported heavyweight motorcycles increased from 11,201 units in October-December 1982 to 81,578 units in April-June 1983.
- o Inventories of imported heavyweight motorcycles increased from 228,078 units as of December 31, 1982, to 266,806 units as of March 31, 1983, and then declined to 219,783 units as of June 30, 1983.

U.S. producers

U.S. production of heavyweight motorcycles fluctuated in a relatively narrow range during October 1982-June 1983. U.S. shipments and exports increased during January-March 1983, compared with those in October-December 1982, and then declined during April-June 1983. Retail sales increased in

each quarter during October 1982-June 1983, primarily because of the cyclical nature of demand for motorcycles. Total inventories (producers' and dealers') followed the normal trend for motorcycles during the period, rising somewhat before the peak sales period of March-May 1983 and then dropping by the end of the second quarter of 1983. Unfilled orders also followed a seasonal trend, reaching the highest level in October-December 1982 and the lowest level in April-June 1983.

The average unit net selling price for U.S.-produced heavyweight motorcycles increased from \$3,445 in October-December 1982 to \$4,064 in January-March 1983 and \$4,088 in April-June 1983. Total employment (including some nonheavyweight motorcycle employment) increased from an average of 3,000 persons in October-December 1982 to 3,089 persons in January-March 1983 and then to 3,099 persons in April-June 1983. Annual capacity remained stable during 1982, with no significant quarterly increases or decreases.

U.S. imports

U.S. imports of heavyweight motorcycles increased from 48,145 units in October-December 1982 to 67,301 units in January-March 1983 and then decreased to 21,016 units in April-June 1983 (table 1). Shipments of imported heavyweight motorcycles increased from 34,631 units in October-December 1982 to 57,197 units in January-March 1983 and then dropped slightly to 54,257 units in April-June 1983 (table 2). Retail sales of imported heavyweight motorcycles followed a trend similar to that of domestic models, increasing from 11,201 units in October-December 1982 to 81,578 units in April-June 1983 (table 3).

During October 1982-June 1983, combined importers' and dealers' inventories of imported heavyweight motorcycles increased from 288,078 units as of December 31, 1982, to 266,806 units as of March 31, 1983, and then declined

to 219,783 units as of June 30, 1983 (tables 4 and 5). U.S. importers' inventories decreased from 130,541 units as of December 31, 1982, to 115,690 units as of June 30, 1983; dealers' inventories increased from 97,537 units to 104,093 units during the corresponding periods.
