HIGHLIGHTS

U.S. production.--Preliminary data indicate that production of nonrubber footwear during the second quarter of 1988 declined by 9 percent compared with the corresponding period of 1987 to 53 million pairs, valued at \$914 million (table 1).

U.S. imports.--U.S. imports in the second quarter of 1988 totaled 226 million pairs, valued at almost \$1.9 billion, representing a 7-percent decline in quantity but a 10-percent gain in value from year-earlier period (tables 3 and 4).

During the second quarter of 1988, imports from Taiwan, the largest supplier, declined by 25 percent in quantity and 8 percent in value to 82 million pairs, valued at \$531 million. Shipments from Korea, the second largest source, totaled 52 million pairs, valued at \$544 million, representing less than a 1-percent gain in quantity, but a 41-percent rise in value. Imports from Brazil, the third largest supplier, grew by about 4 percent in terms of quantity and value to 29 million pairs, valued at \$237 million. Shipments from Italy fell by 14 percent during the period to 11 million pairs; the value of its shipments fell by 7 percent to \$200 million. Imports from China and Thailand showed the greatest growth during the period. Shipments from China, now the fourth largest supplier in terms of quantity, increased by 66 percent in quantity and more than doubled in value to 22 million pairs, valued at \$53 million. Imports from Thailand more than doubled in terms of volume, reaching 4 million pairs. The value of Thailand's shipments in the second quarter totaled \$26 million, representing an increase of more than 200 percent over the year-earlier period.

U.S. exports.--Exports in the second quarter totaled 5 million pairs, valued at \$64 million, representing increases of 60 percent in quantity and 71 percent in value from year-earlier levels (tables 13-15).

Apparent U.S. consumption.--Preliminary data indicate that apparent consumption of nonrubber footwear in the second quarter of 1988 declined by 9 percent from the year-earlier level to 274 million pairs, valued at \$2.7 billion (table 1).

Ratio of imports to consumption.--Preliminary data for the second quarter of 1988 show that imports' share of the U.S. nonrubber footwear market averaged 83 percent in terms of quantity and a record 69 percent in terms of value (table 1).

Prices.--The Producer Price Index and the Consumer Price Index for footwear in the second quarter of 1988 increased by 6 percent and 3 percent, respectively, from their year-earlier levels (table 2).

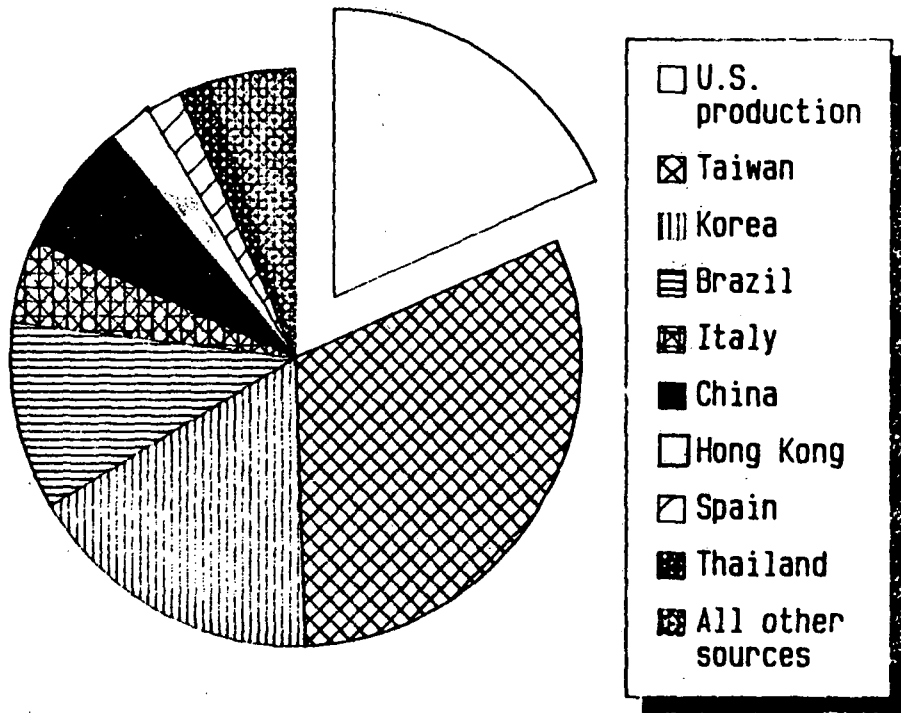
Employment and unemployment rate.--Preliminary data show that the total number of persons employed in the U.S. nonrubber footwear industry during the second quarter of 1988 averaged 87,000, down 1 percent from the year-earlier level (table 2). The unemployment rate in the leather and leather products industry ^{1/} for the second quarter was 13.7 percent, compared with 11.1 percent during the same period last year (table 2).

Rubber footwear.--Preliminary data indicate that, during the second quarter of 1988, U.S. production of footwear with fabric uppers and soles of rubber or plastics, including sneakers, joggers, and certain casual shoes, increased by 17 percent over the corresponding 1987 level to 23 million pairs. Imports totaled 41 million pairs, a 28-percent gain from the 1987 level, and accounted for 64 percent of the U.S. market (table 6).

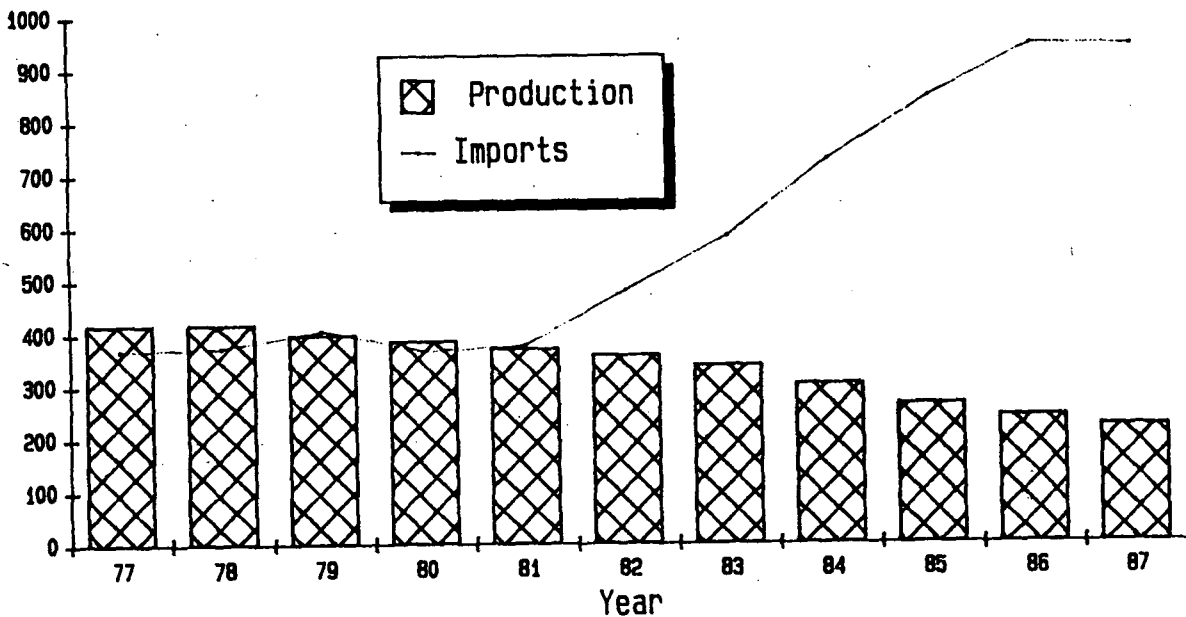
Preliminary data show that U.S. production of protective footwear in the second quarter of 1988 increased by 61 percent to 4.5 million pairs. Imports decreased by 8 percent to 2.2 million pairs, resulting in imports having a 34 percent share of the U.S. market compared with 47 percent during the same period last year (table 6).

Nonrubber footwear: U.S. market shares, by quantity, January-June 1988

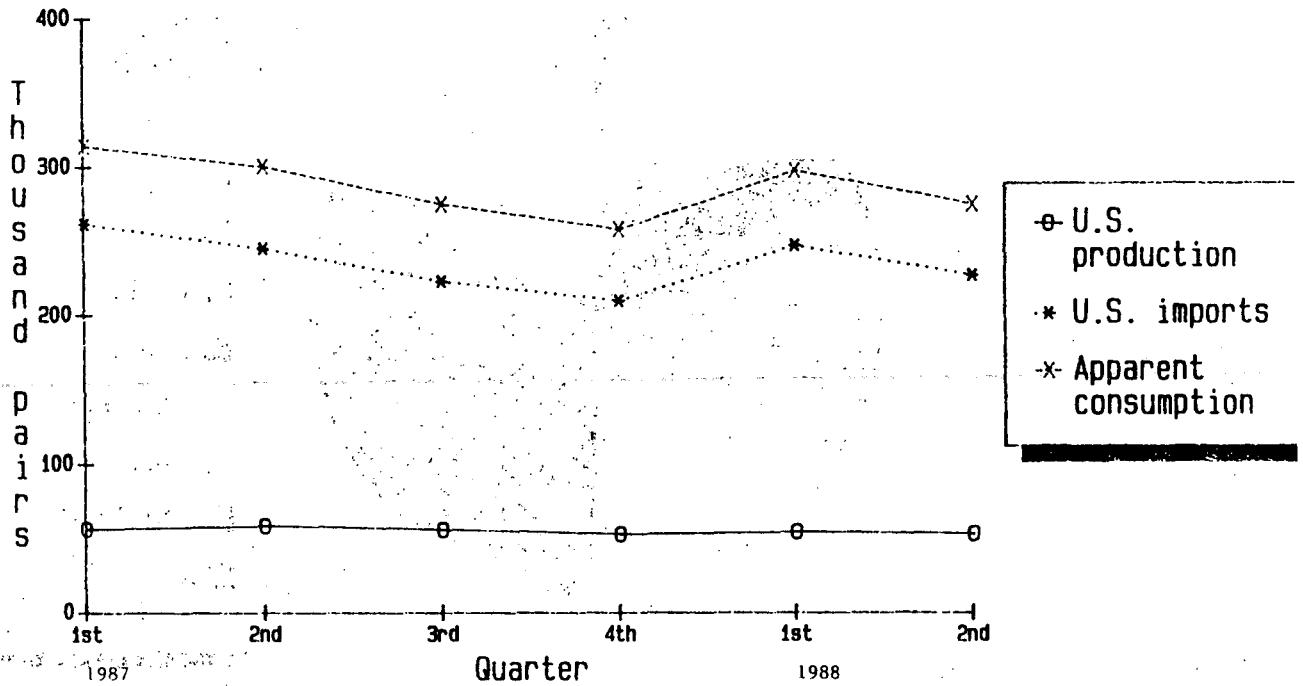


Nonrubber footwear: U.S. production and imports for consumption, in millions of pairs, 1977-87

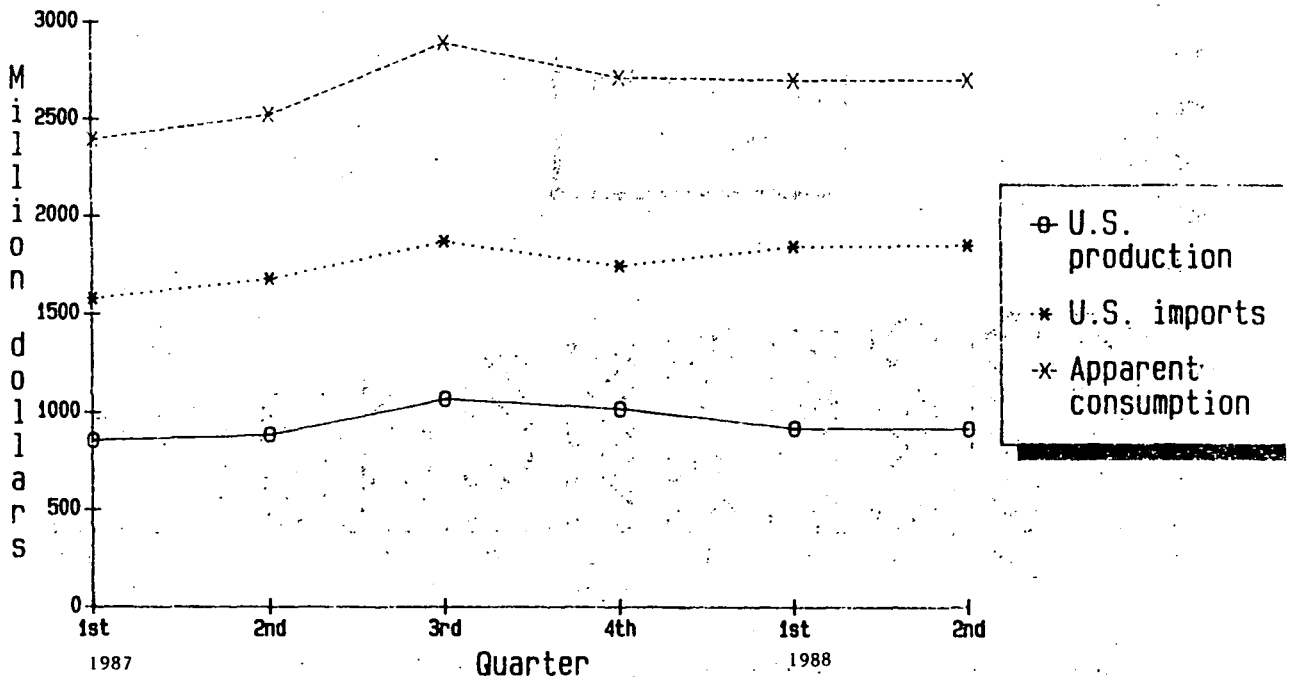
