

NONRUBBER FOOTWEAR QUARTERLY STATISTICAL REPORT

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on Finance on Investigation
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HIGHLIGHTS

U.S. production.--Preliminary data indicate that production of nonrubber footwear decreased by 10 percent during the second quarter of 1990, compared with the corresponding period of 1989 to 52 million pairs, valued at \$1.1 billion (table 1).

U.S. imports.--Imports of nonrubber footwear in the second quarter of 1990 totaled 221 million pairs, valued at \$2 billion, representing increases of 7 percent in quantity and 14 percent in value from year-earlier levels. This marked the third consecutive year-to-year quarterly increase in imports. The quarterly increase brought imports for the first half of this year to 454 million pairs, valued at \$3.9 billion, marking almost a 7 percent gain in quantity over last year (tables 3 and 4).

During the second quarter of 1990, imports from China reached 60 million pairs, almost doubling those of a year ago and bringing China's shipments for the first half of this year to 113 million pairs, valued at \$488 million. As a result, China supplanted Taiwan as the top volume supplier to the U.S. market. Imports from Taiwan continued to fall during the first half of the year, declining by 32 percent, to 97 million pairs, valued at \$688 million. Shipments from Korea partially recovered during the period, rising 2 percent in quantity, to 80 million pairs, and by 21 percent in value, to nearly \$1.1 billion, enabling Korea to remain the largest supplier in terms of value.

Shipments from newer, low-cost sources continued to grow significantly so far this year. Imports from Thailand increased by 57 percent during the first half of this year, climbing to 15 million pairs, valued at \$120 million. Imports from Indonesia, another rapidly growing source, more than tripled to 14 million pairs, valued \$98 million (tables 3-5).

U.S. exports.--Export volume in the second quarter of 1990 remained relatively unchanged from the year-earlier level of 3.6 million pairs; total volume so far this year is up 3 percent to 7.7 million pairs. In terms of value, however, exports rose by 41 percent in the second quarter, and are up 46 percent for the half to \$125 million. The increase in value was attributed to an increase in exports of high-valued shoes to the EC combined with a decline in shipments of low-valued shoes to Mexico (tables 13 and 14).

Apparent U.S. consumption.--Preliminary data indicate that consumption of nonrubber footwear in the second quarter of 1990 increased by 3 percent from the year-earlier period to 270 million pairs, valued at \$3 billion (table 1). For the first half, consumption totaled 551 million pairs, valued at nearly \$6 billion, reflecting a 2-percent increase in volume from the year-earlier level.

Ratio of imports to consumption.--Preliminary data for the second quarter of 1990 show that imports' share of the U.S. nonrubber footwear market increased by 3 percentage points in quantity to 82 percent, but decreased by 1 percentage point in value to 67 percent (table 1). For the first half, imports captured 82 percent of the market by volume.

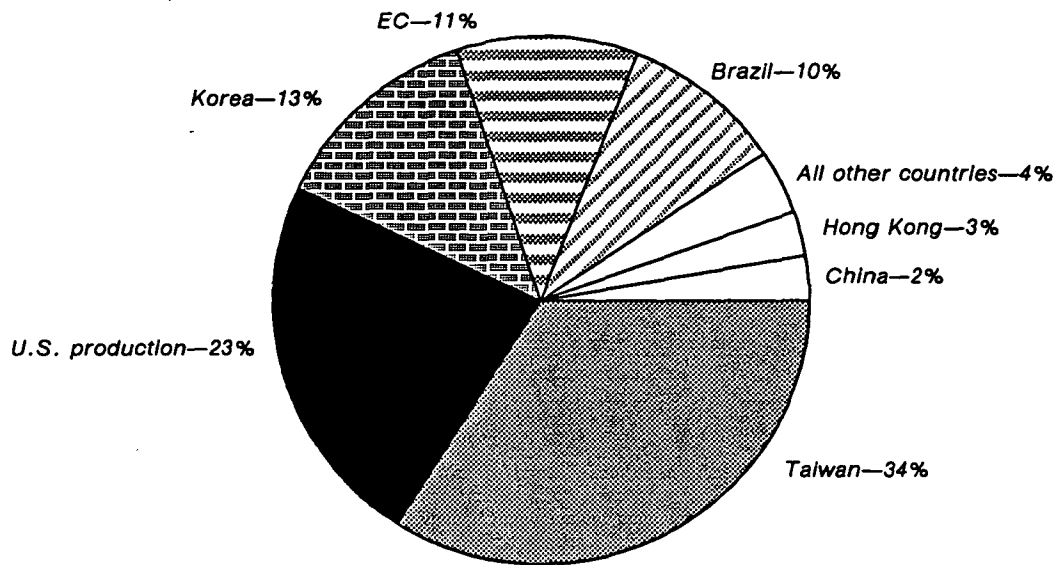
Prices.--The Producer Price Index and the Consumer Price Index for footwear in the second quarter of 1990 increased by 4 percent and 3 percent, respectively, from their year-earlier levels (table 2).

Employment.--Preliminary data show that the total number of persons employed in the U.S. nonrubber footwear industry during the second quarter of 1990 declined by 7 percent from the corresponding 1989 level to an average of 75,300 (table 2).

Rubber footwear.--Preliminary data indicate that, during the second quarter of 1990, U.S. production of footwear with fabric uppers and soles of rubber or plastics, including sneakers, joggers, and certain casual shoes, increased by 11 percent from the corresponding 1989 level to 22 million pairs. This brought the total for the first half to 45 million pairs (table 6). During the second quarter, imports totaled 58 million pairs, valued at \$175 million. For the first half of the year, imports increased by 18 percent to almost 130 million pairs, valued at \$385 million (tables 7 and 8).

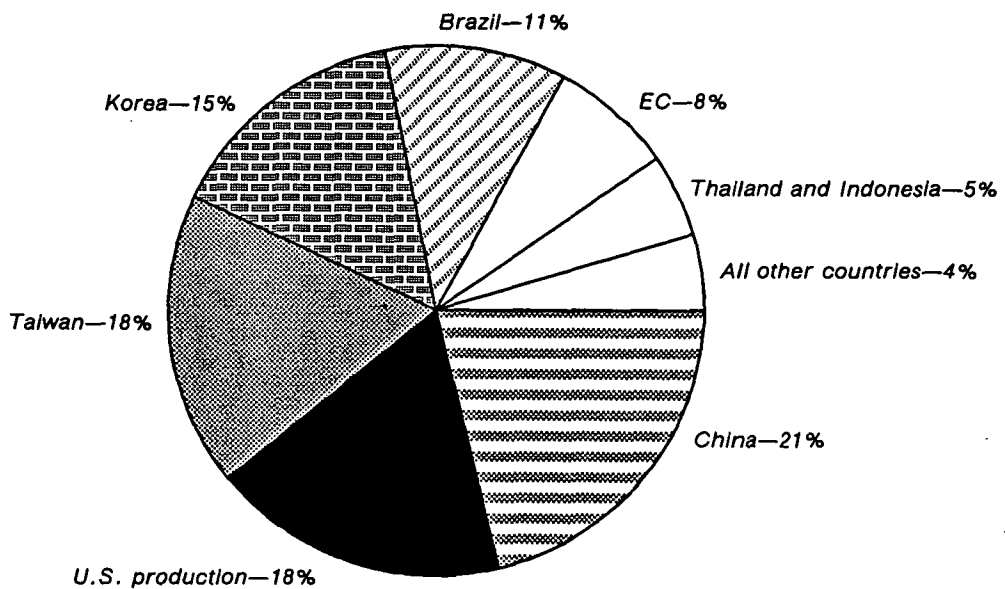
Preliminary data show that U.S. production of protective footwear in the second quarter of 1990 increased by 23 percent to 4.8 million pairs, bringing the total for the first half to nearly 10 million pairs (table 6). Imports also increased in the second quarter, rising by 24 percent to 2 million pairs. So far this year, imports of protective footwear amounted to almost 4 million pairs, representing a 37-percent gain from the year-earlier level (tables 10 and 11).

Nonrubber footwear: U.S. market shares, by quantity, 1985



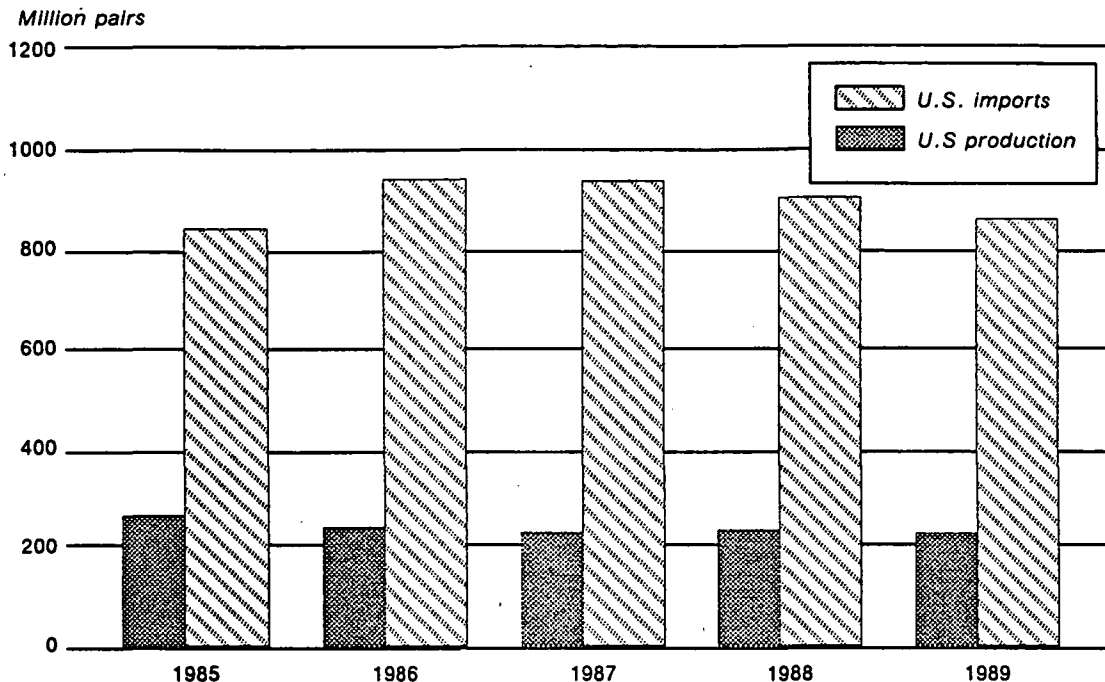

Nonrubber footwear: U.S. market shares, by quantity, January-June 1990



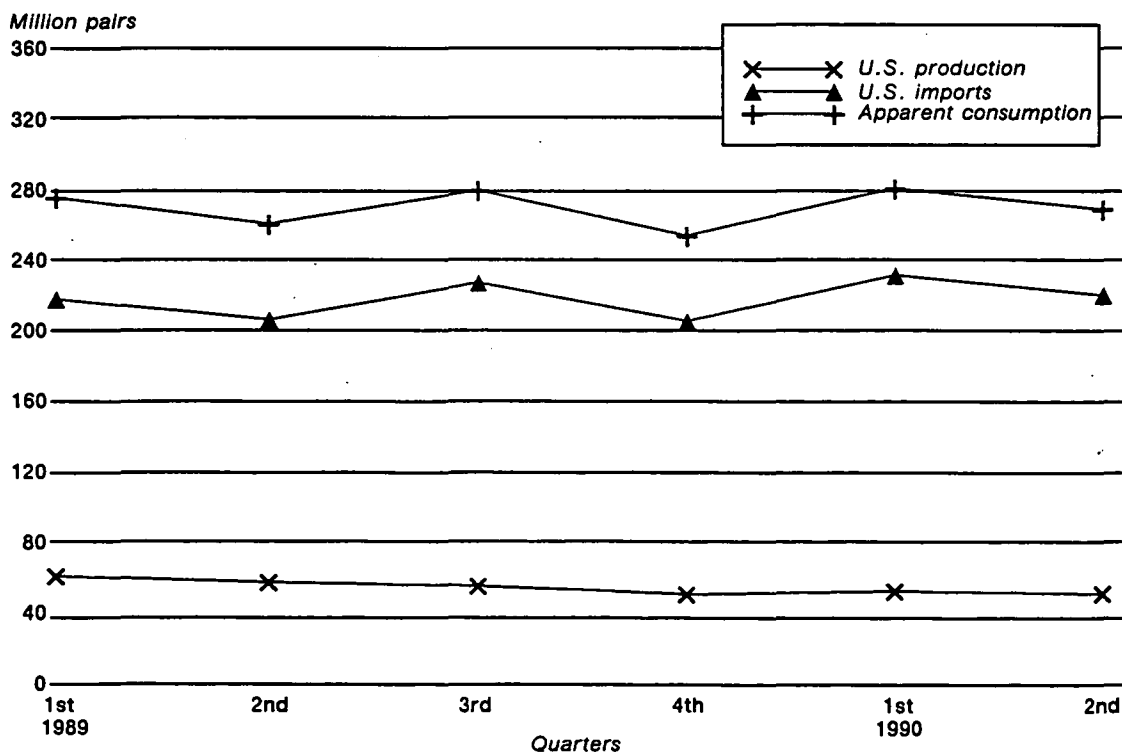
