

# **NONRUBBER FOOTWEAR QUARTERLY STATISTICAL REPORT**

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## HIGHLIGHTS

**U.S. production.**--Production of nonrubber footwear decreased by 10 percent during the third quarter of 1990, compared with the corresponding period of 1989 to 50 million pairs, valued at \$1.2 billion (table 1).

**U.S. imports.**--U.S. imports of nonrubber footwear in the third quarter of 1990 totaled 237 million pairs, valued at \$2.4 billion, representing increases of 4 percent in quantity and 12 percent in value from year-earlier levels. This marked the fourth consecutive year-to-year quarterly increase in imports. The quarterly increase brought imports for the first 9 months of 1990 to 690 million pairs, valued at \$6.3 billion, marking almost a 6-percent gain over the same period in 1989 (tables 3 and 4).

During the third quarter of 1990, imports from China, now the major supplier to the United States, reached 80 million pairs, almost doubling those of 1989. This brought China's shipments for the January-September 1990 period to 193 million pairs, valued at \$902 million. Imports from Taiwan, the second major supplier, continued to fall during the latter period, declining by 35 percent, to 136 million pairs, valued at \$1 billion. Shipments from Korea declined by 3 percent to 127 million pairs, but rose by 16 percent in terms of value to \$1.7 billion. This enabled Korea to remain the largest supplier in terms of value.

Shipments from newer, low-cost sources continued to grow significantly in the first 9 months of 1990. Imports from Indonesia more than tripled, climbing to 24 million pairs (\$164 million). Imports from Thailand, another rapidly growing source, increased by 48 percent to 22 million pairs (\$188 million) (tables 3-5).

**U.S. exports.**--Export volume in the third quarter of 1990 remained relatively unchanged from the year-earlier level of about 3.5 million pairs; total volume for the first 9 months also remained stable at 11 million pairs. In terms of value, however, exports rose by 30 percent in the third quarter, and were up 41 percent for the first 9 months of 1990 to almost \$187 million (tables 13 and 14).

**Apparent U.S. consumption.**--Preliminary data indicate that consumption of nonrubber footwear in the third quarter of 1990 increased by 1 percent from the year-earlier period to 283 million pairs; valued at \$3.5 billion (table 1). For the first 9 months, consumption totaled 833 million pairs, valued at \$9.3 billion, reflecting a 2-percent increase from the year-earlier level.

**Ratio of imports to consumption.**--Preliminary data for the third quarter of 1990 show that imports' share of the U.S. nonrubber footwear market increased by 3 percentage points in quantity to a record 84 percent, but decreased by 1 percentage point in value to 68 percent (table 1). So far in 1990, imports accounted for 83 percent of the market by volume.

**Prices.**--The Producer Price Index and the Consumer Price Index for footwear in the third quarter of 1990 increased by 4 percent and 2 percent respectively, from their year-earlier levels (table 2).

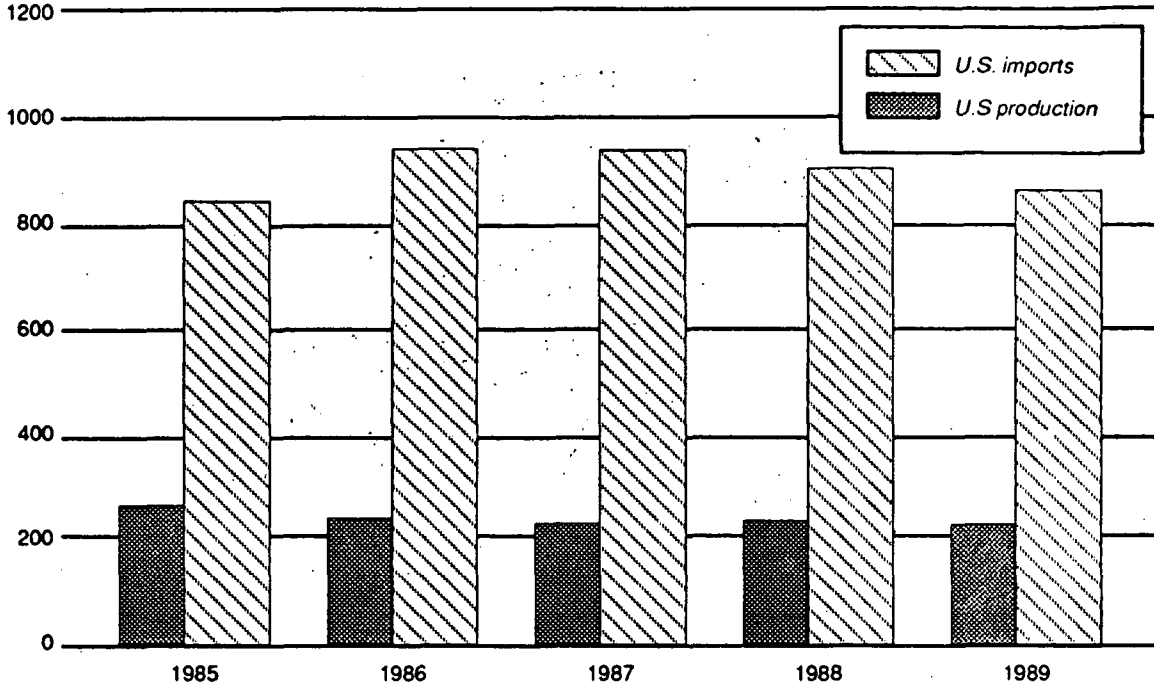
**Employment.**--Preliminary data show that the total number of persons employed in the U.S. nonrubber footwear industry during the third quarter of 1990 declined by 7 percent from the corresponding 1989 level to an average of 70,300 (table 2).

**Rubber footwear.**--Preliminary data indicate that, during the third quarter of 1990, U.S. production of footwear with fabric uppers and soles of rubber or plastics, including sneakers, joggers, and certain casual shoes, decreased by 11 percent from the corresponding 1989 level to 16 million pairs. This brought the total for the first 9 months to 60 million pairs (table 6). During the third quarter, imports totaled 33 million pairs, valued at \$126 million. For the year 1990, so far, imports increased by 10 percent to 162 million pairs, valued at \$511 million (tables 7 and 8).

Preliminary data show that U.S. production of protective footwear in the third quarter of 1990 increased by 3 percent to 3.4 million pairs, bringing the total for the first 9 months to 11 million pairs (table 6). Imports decreased in the third quarter, falling by 18 percent to 2.7 million pairs. So far in 1990, imports of protective footwear amounted to almost 6.5 million pairs, representing a 7-percent gain from the year-earlier level (tables 10 and 11).

**Nonrubber footwear: U.S. production and imports for consumption, 1985-89**

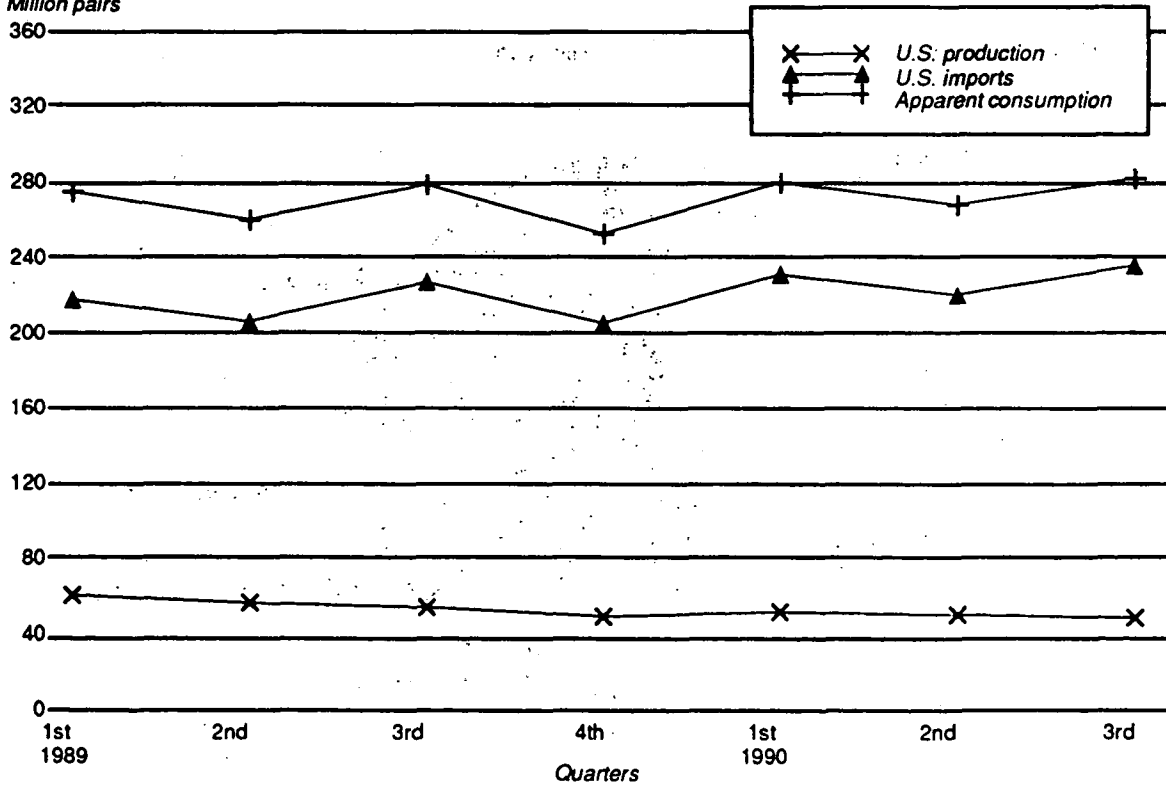
Million pairs

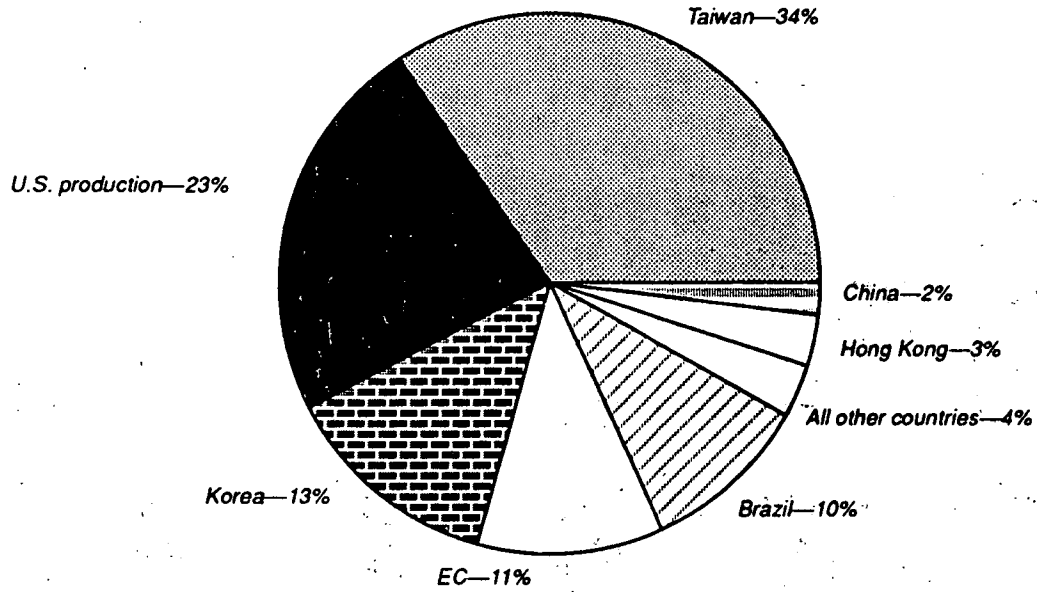
**Nonrubber footwear: Quantity of U.S. production, imports for consumption, and apparent consumption, by quarters, 1989-90**

Million pairs



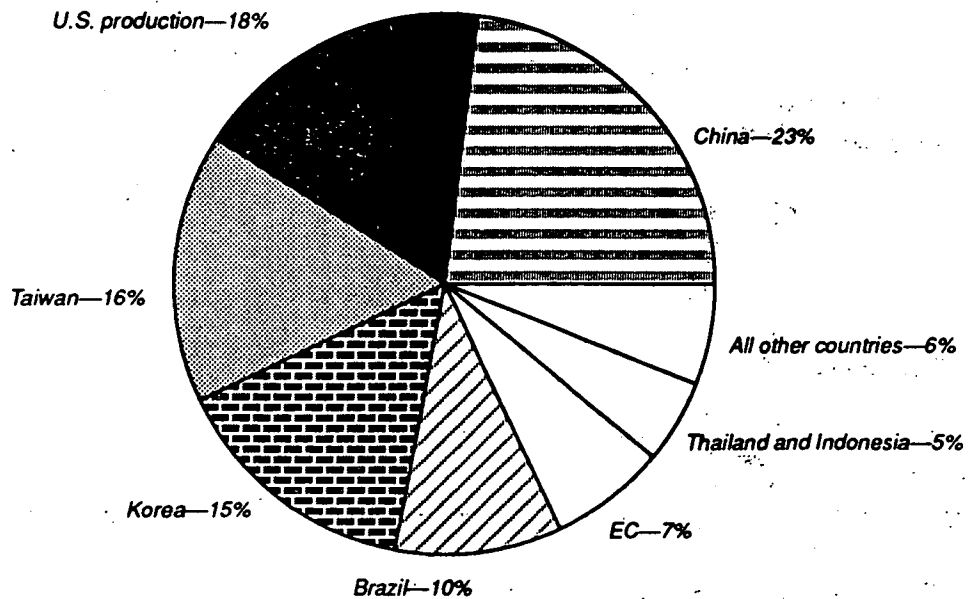
