USITC PUBLISHES FOURTH REPORT OF CERTAIN QUARTERLY STATISTICS FOR PROCESSED MUSHROOMS

The United States International Trade Commission has completed its fourth quarterly report on processed mushrooms. The report is made pursuant to a Presidential request dated March 10, 1977, and covers the first six-month periods of the marketing years 1976/77 and 1977/78, and the quarters October-December 1976, July-September 1977, and October-December 1977.

This report, which is sent to the Special Representative for Trade Negotiations, provides information for monitoring import competition in the U.S. market for processed mushrooms. It also contains data on the inventories, production, and sales of U.S. canners, by container size and style of pack; U.S. sales of frozen mushrooms; U.S. imports for consumption, by country of origin; U.S. exports; and apparent U.S. consumption.
