Provisions for imposing a duty of 50 percent sd valorem on the cost of equipment purchased or repairs made abroad for merchant vessels of the United States, and for remission of the duty under certain circumstances are contained in section 466 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended. 1/ These provisions are extended to repairs and equipment of aircraft registered in the United States by section 6.10 of the Customs Regulations:
