

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PREFACE

On May 11, 1993, the U.S. International Trade Commission (the Commission) instituted investigation No. 1205-3, Proposed Modifications to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States, Pursuant to Section 1205 of the Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act of 1988. Section 1205 requires the Commission to keep the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTS) under continuous review and to recommend to the President modifications to the HTS in order to reflect amendments to the Harmonized System convention recommended by the Customs Cooperation Council (CCC) for adoption, and as other circumstances warrant. The modifications proposed in this report would implement in U.S. law amendments to the Harmonized System nomenclature that were recommended for adoption by the CCC in July 1993, and certain other decisions, taken by the CCC's Harmonized System Committee, that are necessary and appropriate to ensure uniform application of the nomenclature.

In accordance to section 1205, the Commission solicited, and gave consideration to, the views of interested Federal agencies and the public before proposing recommendations to the HTS. Further, the Commission's report to the President presents its recommendations, summarizes the information on which its recommendations are based, and provides a statement of the probable economic effects of recommended changes on any industry in the United States. A copy of all written comments received from Federal agencies and a copy or Commission-prepared summary of the views of other interested parties are also be included.

Notice of this investigation was published in the <u>Federal Register</u> of May 20, 1993, and made reference to a draft of proposed modifications, which was made available for the purpose of soliciting public comment. A public hearing on this investigation was held on June 15, 1993. The information contained in this report was obtained from (a) research by the Commission's staff, (b) the Commission's files, (c) consultations with various Government agencies, (d) the written submissions and oral statements of interested parties, and (e) other sources.

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Recommendations

On May 11, 1993, the U.S. International Trade Commission (Commission) instituted investigation No. 1205-3, Proposed Modifications to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States, Pursuant to Section 1205 of the Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act of 1988. The Commission's notice of institution of this investigation is reproduced in appendix A.

Consequent to its investigation, the Commission recommends that the President proclaim the modifications to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTS) set forth in appendix B of this report. The Commission considers these modifications necessary or appropriate to conform the HTS with amendments to the Harmonized System Convention recommended bv the Customs Cooperation Council, and to promote the uniform application of the Harmonized System nomenclature. The modifications are being recommended pursuant to section 1205 of the Omnibus Trade Competitiveness Act of 1988 (19 U.S.C. 3005).

Background

The Harmonized System Convention

Subtitle B of title 1 of the Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act of 1988 approved the United States' accession to the International Convention on the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System, which was completed in Brussels on June 14, 1983, under the auspices of the Customs Cooperation Council (CCC). The Convention establishes a standardized tariff nomenclature, the purpose of which is to facilitate international trade through the use of a single nomenclature for the description, classification, and coding of goods, and to facilitate the collection, comparison, and analysis of international trade

statistics. Article 3 of the convention obligates each contracting party to apply the HS nomenclature as the basis for its customs tariff nomenclature and for publication of foreign trade data.²

HS Convention also established Harmonized System Committee (HSC), which is composed of contracting parties and has the function of preparing recommendations for uniformity in the interpretation of the HS nomenclature and for keeping its product categories abreast of technological developments and changes in international trading patterns. Recommendations take the form of proposed amendments to the convention, (particularly the HS nomenclature annexed thereto) or to one or more of the complementary publications of the CCC. The most important of these publications are the Explanatory Notes and the Compendium of Classification Opinions. The contracting parties to the convention rely on these publications to provide guidance to the interpretation of the HS nomenclature. However, though these publications are authoritative sources of information, they are not legally binding on contracting parties to the HS Convention and should not to be treated as dispositive in ascertaining the classification of merchandise under the HS.3

Recommended amendments to the HS nomenclature generally arise from two sources: (1) the HSC's consideration of classification disputes or questions raised by contracting parties to the convention and (2) recommendations of the Review Subcommittee (RSC), which was established in 1990 by the HSC to review the HS nomenclature and to consider amendments to keep it up to date. Most of the amendments contained in the CCC's article 16 recommendation under consideration in this investigation reflect RSC proposals that resulted from its initial 3-year review cycle.

Amendments to the HS recommended by the CCC for adoption are deemed to be accepted, under article 16 of the HS Convention, 6 months after the date of notification of the recommendation, unless a contracting party to the convention notifies the CCC of its objection thereto. By agreement of the

contracting parties, amendments to the Explanatory Notes or to the Compendium of Classification Opinions are deemed accepted if no objection is notified within 3 months of approval by the HSC.

Executive Authority

Sections 1205 and 1206 of the Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act of 1988 (reproduced in appendix C) establish an administrative mechanism by which the President may proclaim certain modifications to the HTS, including those necessary to conform its provisions to proposed amendments to the HS nomenclature. Section 1205 directs the Commission to keep the HTS under continuous review and to recommend such modifications to the President when amendments to the HS nomenclature are adopted by the CCC and as other circumstances warrant

Section 1205(a) of the act provides that the Commission—

- ... shall recommend to the President such modifications in the Harmonized Tariff Schedule as [it] considers necessary or appropriate—
- to conform the [HTS] with amendments made to the Convention;⁴
- (2) to promote the uniform application of the Convention and particularly the Annex thereto;
- (3) to ensure that the HTS is kept up-to-date in light of changes in technology or changes in patterns of international trade;
- (4) to alleviate unnecessary administrative burdens; and
- (5) to make technical rectifications.⁵

Section 1205(d) provides that the Commission may not recommend a modification to the HTS, unless such modification (1) is "consistent with the Harmonized System Convention or any amendment thereto recommended for adoption;" (2) is "consistent with sound nomenclature principles;" and (3) "ensure[s] substantial rate neutrality." Modifications that involve a change in any rate of duty must be consequent to, or necessitated by, recommended nomenclature changes. Finally, recommended modifications "must not alter existing conditions of competition for the affected U.S. industry, labor, or trade."

Pursuant to section 1206, the President may proclaim modifications to the HTS, on the basis of recommendations by the Commission under section 1205, if he determines that the modifications are in conformity with U.S. obligations under the HS Convention and do not run counter to the national economic interest of the United States. The President may proclaim such modifications only after the expiration of a 60-day⁶ period beginning on the date the President submits a report to the Committee on Ways and Means of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Finance of the Senate that sets forth the proposed modifications and the reasons therefor. Modifications proclaimed by the President may not become effective before the 15th day after the text of the proclamation is published in the Federal Register.

Proposed Modifications

draft of the Commission's proposed modifications, covering substantive changes to three-fourths of the chapters of the HTS, was made available to the public in a document dated May 14, 1993, which was announced through the notice of institution of this investigation. The proposed modifications presented in appendix B to this report reflect revisions made as the result of written comments and oral hearing testimony solicited in connection with the May 14, 1993, document. Copies of written views submitted by Congressional representatives are included in appendix D;⁷ the written submission from Customs is reproduced in

appendix E; summaries of the written views of nongovernment interested parties are included in appendix F; and a summary of the hearing testimony is included in appendix G.

The recommendations in appendix B reflect principally decisions taken by the HSC during its 4th through 11th sessions (i.e., from October 1989 to June 1993) and are divided into two groups, discussed below.

Modifications to Conform U.S. Customs Practice to HSC Decisions not Affecting the International HS Nomenclature

Certain cough drops

According to Customs,8 that agency has consistently classified medicated cough drops-those containing a minimum of 5 mg of menthol, eucalyptol, or other antitussive "flavoring" agent as the sole active ingredient—as medicaments in HTS subheading 3004.90.30, with a most-favored-nation (MFN) duty rate⁹ of 3.9 percent ad valorem. However, the HSC decided that such products are classifiable as confectionery in subheading 1704.90. Customs expressed its desire to conform to the HSC decision, as proposed by the Commission, but it was necessary to propose a new additional U.S. legal note (a) to exclude these products from chapter 30 and (b) to distinguish them from so-called cough drops already classified by Customs in subheading 1704.90 because they lack the required minimum amount of active-ingredient flavoring agent per dose to be considered medicaments. The Commission, therefore, added a proposal for a new additional U.S. note 7 to limit the coverage of proposed new subheading 1704.90.25.

Certain cresols¹⁰

In the HTS, certain polyphenols—metacresol, orthocresol, paracresol and metaparacresol, all the foregoing having a purity of 75 percent or more by weight—are specified in a single rate line under subheading 2707.99 rather than under subheading 2707.60, which covers phenols (including polyphenols). The Commission proposes to transfer the rate line provision to subheading 2707.60 to achieve uniformity of classification of these products under the HS. There is no consequent change in duty rate.

Certain jewelry boxes

At its 4th Session, October 1989, the HSC adopted a modification of the Explanatory Notes to heading 4202 in order to clarify that point-of-purchase jewelry presentation boxes were included in HS heading 4202. The revised Explanatory Note reads as follows:

The term "jewellery boxes" covers not only boxes specially designed for keeping jewellery, but also similar lidded containers of various dimensions (with or without hinges or fasteners) specially shaped or fitted to contain one or more pieces of jewellery and normally lined with textile material, of the type in which articles of jewellery are often presented and sold and which are suitable for long-term use. 11

The HSC's inclusion of point-of-purchase jewelry presentation boxes in heading 4202 was counter to prior headquarters advice by Customs. In ruling HQ 081456, dated August 17, 1988, Customs stated that a small, cylindrical earring box of plastics, covered with woven cotton cloth, was not a jewelry box and, therefore, the box must be classified by its essential character, i.e., as an article of plastics or of textile material. In that case, the plastics was deemed to impart the essential character and the box was classified in HTS subheading 3923.90 as an article of plastics for the conveyance or packing of goods. Because this ruling was issued before implementation of the HTS, Customs warned that the advice may be subject to change.

However, after implementation of the HTS, Customs issued at least three similar rulings. In HQ 084732, dated August 24, 1989, Customs specifically stated that it "does not agree with the position of the HSC with respect to the merchandise at issue." The merchandise at issue in this ruling was a small ring box of plastics covered by a flocked textile material. This box was held to be classifiable in HTS subheading 3923.90.00, with an MFN duty rate of 3 percent ad valorem.

In ruling letter HO 086186, dated January 2, 1990, Customs addressed 12 samples, including square and rectangular boxes of plastics or of metal, all covered with paper or textile materials. According to the ruling letter, all the sample boxes were "designed for the display of jewelry and related items as well as the transportation and protection of those items after purchase and up until the time of first use." Customs further stated that "the term 'jewelry boxes' does not include these goods." Without more specific component material information, Customs would not make a binding ruling on these boxes, but did say that it would classify them "as containers or articles made of the component material which provides the item's essential character." In a subsequent ruling, HQ 089830, dated July 26, 1991, Customs ruled that five sample boxes of steel or iron, covered with textile fabric, for the display of jewelry, were not "jewelry boxes" for the purposes of heading 4202 and were, therefore, classifiable by their essential character in HTS subheading 7310.29.00, with an MFN duty rate of Free.

In January 1992, Customs announced its intention to reconsider rulings 086186 and 089830. Following comprehensive consultations with the importers and domestic producers of these products, Customs issued a ruling letter (HQ 951028, dated March 3, 1993) that revoked both prior rulings. The result was that the point-of-purchase jewelry presentation boxes in question would now be classifiable in HTS subheading 4202.90.90, with an MFN duty rate of 20 percent ad valorem.

On March 9, 1993, counsel representing importers of these boxes requested that, pursuant to section 1205, the Commission propose modifications to heading 4202 to restore duty rates that were applicable before Customs revoked rulings 086186 and 089830. The importers' specific proposal was to insert the following new subheadings under HTS heading 4202:¹²

It is recalled that, under section 1205(a), the Commission shall recommend HTS modifications that it considers necessary or appropriate (1) to conform the HTS with amendments made to the HS Convention, (2) to promote the uniform application of the HS nomenclature, (3) to ensure that the HTS is kept up to date in light of changes in technology or in trade patterns, (4) to alleviate unnecessary administrative burdens, and (5) to make technical rectifications. It is further recalled that, under section 1205(d), any proposed modification, among other things, must ensure substantial duty-rate neutrality and must not alter existing competitive conditions affecting U.S. industry, labor, or trade.

The importers claimed that the basis for Customs' revocation of its prior rulings concerning these products was the HSC's adoption of the revised Explanatory Note that included these products in heading 4202. Because Customs was changing its classification practice to promote the uniform application of the HS nomenclature, transfer of these products from other HTS chapters (depending on the material imparting essential character to the boxes) to chapter 42 should be made, in the importers' view, in such manner as to ensure rate neutrality and maintain existing conditions of competition in the U.S. industry, as outlined in section 1205(d).

Customs, in its submission to the Commission, stated that "[u]ntil recently, the Customs Service had no established practice or position regarding the classification" of the subject boxes. The submission continues by saying that Customs "has since issued several rulings which reflect a consistent classification for jewelry presentation boxes in heading 4202." The implication is that Customs has promoted uniformity with the HS Convention by its recent rulings classifying these boxes in heading 4202. The submission concludes this issue by stating that it does "not regard the proposed tariff provisions in heading 4202 as necessary..." and by recommending "that the Commission reconsider its proposal to amend heading 4202...."

The Commission does not consider that the importers have demonstrated sufficient justification for it to recommend proposed modifications to the President in this regard, because none of the conditions for making such recommendations, as outlined in section 1205(a), appear to be met by such proposals. First, no amendment of the HS Convention occurred as a result of the HSC's adoption of the new Explanatory Note that confirmed the inclusion of point-of-purchase jewelry presentation boxes in heading 4202. Second, uniform application of the Convention has apparently been promoted by Customs' recent rulings to reclassify these

products—changes in duty rates notwithstanding—in heading 4202. Third, changes in technology or trade patterns are not at issue in this case. Fourth, the importers' proposal does not alleviate any unnecessary administrative burden and, in fact, may lead to increased administrative burden. Finally, the proposed modifications cannot be considered to be within the realm of technical rectifications to the HTS.

The Commission notes that Customs is the administrative agency responsible for U.S. import tariff classification. If a change in tariff treatment by Customs is felt to be incorrect, importers and domestic producers have administrative and judicial remedies available to them. These remedies are available, whether or not changes in Customs treatment are based on HSC decisions.

Certain support hosiery

As part of Presidential Proclamation 6515, dated December 16, 1992, 13 surgical compression stockings for orthopedic purposes were given separate tariff treatment under new HTS subheading 6115.93.15. Subsequently, the proponent of this modification, Sigvaris, Inc., through legal counsel, notified the Commission that the new provision covered only stockings of synthetic fibers and omitted consideration of such stockings made of cotton. Further, according to Sigvaris, the transfer of surgical compression products from chapter 90 to chapter 61 should have included panty hose of synthetic fibers and of cotton. These modifications are included in the Commission's recommendation.

Modifications to Conform the HTS with Amendments to the HS Nomenclature

This group of proposed modifications are required to implement a recommendation to amend the HS Convention adopted by the CCC on July 4, 1993. The amendments reflect (1) the culmination of a 3-year effort by the HSC's Review Subcommittee to update the international HS to reflect new product and manufacturing technologies and changing world trade patterns and (2) other HSC classification decisions requiring changes to the legal text of the HS nomenclature. Under article 16 the HS Convention, these changes are to become effective on January 1, 1996, unless an objection is entered by any contracting party by January 5, 1994.

Probable Economic Effects of Proposed Modifications

In the Commission's judgment, the proposed modifications do not alter existing Customs tariff treatment of the commodities involved. Furthermore, the modifications do not alter existing conditions of competition for the affected U.S. industry, labor, or trade. Consequently, it is believed that the modifications, if proclaimed, would ensure substantial rate neutrality and would have no significant economic effect on U.S. industry or labor.

The existing plans do not identify these lands as suitable for disposal. However, because of resource values, public values, and objective involved, the public interest may be well served by disposal of these lands to local government entities. An environmental assessment will be prepared to analyze the impacts of this proposal and alternatives.

Background and Scope of Investigation

On May 11, 1998, the Commission instituted investigation No. 1205–3, Proposed Modifications to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States, pursuant to section: 1205 of the Oranibus Trade and Competitiveness Act of 1986. Section 1205 directs the Commission to keep the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTS) under continuous review and to recommend modifications to the HTS (1) when amendments to the International Convention on the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (Hermenized System) and the Protocol thereto, are recommended by the Customs Cooperation Council (CCC) for adoption, and (2) as other circumstances warrant

The CCC is expected to recommend in: July 1993 certain modifications to the nomencleture of the international Harmonized System, in accordance with Article 16 of the Harmonized System. Convention. The changes proposed to conform the HTS with the CCC's recommendations and to reflect certain. other decisions taken by the Harmonized System Committee (HSC) are available in the Office of the Secretary, Room 112, United State International Trade Commission, 500 E. Street SW, Washington, DC 20436 (telephone 202-205-2000). These changes cover (1) all decisions taken by the HSC during its 4th through 10th sessions and (2) certain proposals that are subject to further consideration by the HSC at its 11th session. The 11th session was scheduled for the last 2 weeks in April 1993, with a followup in the first week in June 1993. Following the end of HSC's 11th session, a second notice will be issued indicating the finel resolution of these letter questions and any additional decisions taken by the HSC at that time. If necessary, a second. hearing may also be scheduled.

The column 1-special rates shown are those scheduled to be effective on January 1, 1996, as duty-reduction staging schedules are known to exist at the time of this writing. Any staged reductions of the special rates beyond January 1, 1996, will be provided for upon implementation. Future changes in the Generalized System of Preferences, acceleration of rates applicable to eligible imports from Canada under the U.S.-Canada Free-Trade Agreement, future adjustments to duty-free treatment under other U.S. tariff preference programs, potential modifications from the proposed North American Free Trade Agreement, or the Uruguay Round of multilateral trade negotiations under the GATT are not anticipated in this appendix.

Existing statistical annotations in the HTS are not reflected in this appendix, but will be provided for, as appropriate, upon implementation of the proposed modifications.

Miles, Inc., in supporting the proposed new paragraph (g) of note 2 to HTS chapter 39 to exclude from that chapter diagnostic or laboratory reagents on a backing of plastics, suggested that a similar note be proposed to exclude from chapter 48 such reagents on a backing of paper. In fact, the Commission had already proposed such a note to chapter 48 in its May 14 document. Both these exclusion notes come directly from the CCC's article 16 recommendation. Miles also suggested that the term "prepared" be defined for purposes of heading 3822. However, the concept of "preparations" has always proven elusive for the HSC, and by agreement of the contracting parties, no such definition has ever been adopted. For the same reason, the Commission does not propose to introduce such a definition. Nevertheless, the Commission understands that revised heading 3822 is intended to include (1) single, chemically-pure diagnostic or laboratory reagents, if presented on a backing (e.g., of paper or of plastics) and (2) "prepared" or mixed reagents, whether or not they are on a backing. Single chemically-defined reagents not on a backing would be classifiable generally in chapter 28 or 29, as appropriate.

I am writing to convey the sharply negative impact on the domestic jewelry box manufacturing industry of the International Trade Commission's Proposed Modifications under 19 U.S.C. 3005 as they pertain to tariff classification and proposed duty rates for jewelry boxes under HTS subheading 4202.92.

My state of Rhode Island is the home to a significant number of domestic manufacturers of jewelry boxes, employing approximately 3000 workers in Rhode Island and Massachusetts combined. These domestic manufacturers strongly oppose the proposed changes in the tariff classification and corresponding duty rate proposed by the The net impact of these proposed changes would be to reduce the duty rate on jewelry boxes "with outer surfaces of either plastic sheeting or textile materials" from the current 20% to rates ranging from "free" to 7%, depending upon the underlying material used in the manufacture of these boxes. Such changes would have drastic repercussions on the domestic industry.

On March 3, 1993, the U.S. Customs Services issued ruling HQ 951028, classifying jewelry boxes covered with plastic sheeting or textile materials under HTS 4202.92.90 at a duty rate of 20% ad valorem. This decision brought the United States into conformity with the other members of the Harmonized Tariff System and corrected an earlier misclassification.

All other countries who participate in the HTS currently treat this merchandise at the 20% ad valorem duty rate. Therefore, by opposing the proposed change in tariff classification, domestic jewelry manufacturers are requesting only fair and evenhanded treatment with importers to all the countries participating in the HTS. As a result, by altering the tariff rate, the United States would unnecessarily disadvantage a significant domestic industry.

Two Rhode Island manufacturers of jewelry boxes, International Packaging Corporation and Fuller Packaging, will be represented at the ITC hearing scheduled for June 15 (&16). We are writing to express our opposition to a proposed modification to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule (HTS) that is scheduled to be considered by the International Trade Commission tomorrow morning. The modification in question relates to the classification of, and applicable duty rates for, jewelry boxes under HTS subheading 4202.92.

This matter is one with which we are quite familiar, as it is of great importance to the domestic jewelry box industry (largely concentrated in our State of Rhode Island), and until recently was the subject of a lengthy and exhaustive review by the U.S. Customs Service. As you may know, after fourteen months of deliberation, on March 3 of this year Customs issued ruling HQ 951028, revoking two previous Headquarters Ruling Letters and setting forth the final and determinative classification for jewelry presentation cases. In its ruling, Customs followed the guidance set forth in the Explanatory Notes to heading 4202 (as amended by the Harmonize System Committee in April 1988), concluding that "[p]resentation cases used in the presentation and/or sale of jewelry are included within the meaning of the term 'jewelry boxes' as it appears in heading 4202, HTSUSA." As such, the boxes became subject to a duty rate of 20 percent ad valorem.

The proposed modification to be considered tomorrow by the Commission would have the effect of reducing the duty rate on jewelry boxes "with outer surfaces of either plastic sheeting or textile material" from 20 percent to rates ranging from "free" to seven percent. This would for all intents and purposes void the determination set forth in the carefully-crafted March 3 Customs decision. Moreover, the proposed change would fly in the face of international recommendations and practice. As noted by Customs, customs administrations in European and other nations that participate in the Harmonized System classify jewelry presentation boxes under heading 4202; and as noted by domestic manufacturers, these nations treat the articles in question at a duty rate of 20 percent ad valorem.

The domestic jewelry box manufacturing industry is of great importance to our State, employing more than 1,000 in Rhode Island and more than 3,000 in the New England region. The industry, as evidenced by the June 4 letter to the Commission from the Manufacturing Jewelers and Silversmiths of America, and by the witnesses who will testify tomorrow, strongly opposes the proposed changes.

Under Section 1205 of the 1988 Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act, the Commission is charged with recommending changes to the HTS when amendments are "recommended by the Customs Cooperation Council for adoption" and "as other circumstances warrant." Neither holds true in this case. Hence, we see no reason why the Commission should recommend the proposed modification. Not only would the modification have the effect of contravening the recent Customs ruling and international practice, but it would place U.S. domestic manufacturers at a distinct and unjustifiable disadvantage both at home and in overseas markets.

We urge the Commission to reject the proposal, and appreciate your consideration of our views.

Mele Manufacturing is a jewelry box manufacturer employing 400 people and located in Utica, New York. We are writing to ask you for your assistance in opposing proposed changes to import duties on jewelry boxes.

A hearing is scheduled at the International Trade Commission (ITC) on June 15, 1993, to discuss the ITC's Report on Proposed Modifications to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule (HTS), which includes a tariff breakout within HTS4202.92 for jewelry boxes of various materials.

Jewelry boxes were originally mis-classified under heading other than 4202 but in March 1993, Customs Headquarters issued their ruling HQ951028 properly classifying jewelry boxes under HTS4202.92.90 at a duty rate of 20% ad valorem. Importers are now attempting to have this duty rate reduced to either 3% or nothing, depending on the type shell (plastic or steel).

We urge you to help block this proposed change for the following reasons:

- It is not justified to lower the duty for jewelry boxes since they should have been paying this rate of duty all along under 4202 of the HTS.
- There will be a substantial loss of revenue if this duty is lowered or eliminated, which is disturbing in light of the current government financial situation.
- It will result in a loss of jobs in the U.S. The domestic box industry employs several thousand people and additionally supports suppliers employing thousands more.

Please help us in preserving these jobs that belong in the United States and block this indefensible Modification.

Another related matter of importance is that importers are also attempting to eliminate existing quotas for jewelry boxes. I will soon address the quota issue in a separate letter.

Re: International Trade Commission Investigation No. 1205-3, Proposed Modifications to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule Pursuant to Section 1205 of the Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act of 1988

Dear Secretary Bardos:

The U.S. Customs Service submits the following comments on International Trade Commission Investigation No. 1205-3, Proposed Modifications to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule Pursuant to Section 1205 of the Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act of 1988. Our comments regard, first, those proposals to amend the Harmonized Tariff Schedule (HTS) that may become effective on or after January 1, 1994, and second, those proposals to amend the HTS that may become effective on or after January 1, 1996.

Matters on which HTS amendments are proposed to become effective in 1994

Jewelry Boxes: In 1990, the Harmonized System Committee (HSC) approved an amendment to the Explanatory Notes (EN) to heading 4202 to clarify that jewelry presentation boxes sold with jewelry at retail are included within the scope of the term jewelry boxes. Until recently, the Customs Service had no established practice or position regarding the classification of such merchandise.

The Customs Service has since issued several rulings which reflect a consistent classification for jewelry presentation boxes in heading 4202. We do not regard the proposed tariff provisions in heading 4202 as necessary to classify the merchandise. We therefore recommend that the Commission reconsider its proposal to amend heading 4202 in this manner.

Medicated cough drops: The HSC has recently decided that cough drops containing menthol and other "flavoring" agents were classifiable in heading 1704 as confectionery rather than as medicaments of heading 3004, despite the fact that the flavoring agents had medicinal properties. The EN for both headings has been amended to clarify the proper classification of medicated cough drops.

Customs has consistently classified these products in heading 3004. That classification reflected our view, based on scientific evidence, that medicated cough drops contained sufficient amounts of these active ingredients to provide a therapeutic or prophylactic use. We continue to believe that the merchandise is properly classifiable as medicaments in chapter 30. However, the HSC has reconfirmed its decision on the classification of these products.

Thus, in order to enable us to classify these products in conformance with the HSC decision, we suggest that an appropriate US note be drafted excluding them from chapter 30. In addition, we believe that a tariff provision as proposed for 1704.90.25, cough drops, is necessary for the proper classification of the products in question.

Matters on which HTS amendments are proposed to become effective in 1996

- 1) It appears that, in the proposal on vodka, the current vodka provisions (HTSUS subheadings 2208.90.60, 2208.90.65, and 2208.90.70) need to be omitted with the adoption of subheading 2208.60.
- 2) Under subheading 2916.34, "Ester of phenylacetic acid" should reflect the plural "Esters;" therefore, the subheading should be modified to read "Esters of phenylacetic acid."
- 3) The text "Subheadings 2932.90 through 2932.90.50 are superseded by the following:" should be modified to reflect the appropriate eight digit number for the first subheading. That text should read "Subheadings 2932.90.41 through 2932.50 are superseded by the following:".

- 4) Apparently, heading 4810, HTSUS, has been inadvertently omitted from the list of headings in the proposed Note 7(A). It exists in the listing of headings in the current Note 7 and we are aware of no justification for its omission.
- 5) Regarding your last proposal on snowboard boots, Customs has previously classified leather upper snowboard boots in HTS subheadings 6403.91.60 and .91.90. The wording and the duty rates from those current subheadings should be replicated in this proposal. Specifically, a tariff provision should be created for snowboard boots for men, youths and boys at 8.5% and a tariff provision for snowboard boots for other persons at 10%. There has never been a 37.5% rate of duty in leather upper footwear, as is suggested by this proposal.

Customs has classified textile upper snowboard boots in HTS subheading 6404.19.20 at a 37.5% rate of duty. With the amendment to the HS chapter 64 subheading note 1(b), such snowboard boots will move to subheading 6404.11. Due to the tariff structure in heading 6404, snowboard boots will need to be provided for at the same level of indentation as the six-digit subheading in order to preserve the 37.5% rate of duty currently being applied, unless the Commission wishes to replicate snowboard boots at every eight-digit description in 6404.11.

- 6) The text "Heading 7314 is superseded by the following:" should be modified to read "Heading 7314 and its subheadings are superseded by the following:"
- 7) The new tariff number 8517.11.00, HTSUS, will provide for "cordless" telephone sets. It appears that the current subheading 8525.20.50, HTSUS, which provides for "Cordless handset telephones" should be deleted and the duty rate for 8517.11.00 should be changed to 6.0 percent.
- 8) Effective in 1996, the HSC has approved the amendment of the text of heading 8525 to specifically include still image video cameras, grouping them with television cameras. The Commission is recommending a new tariff provision, 8525.40.40 for such products.

The Customs Service has ruled that still video cameras are classified in tariff provision 9013.80.60 as optical appliances and instruments. The classification of these products is currently the

subject of litigation in the Court of International Trade. Given the pending litigation, we are not certain that the duty rate proposed for tariff provision 8525.40.40 will reflect the outcome of the litigation. Thus, we would like the Commission to defer finalizing the duty rate until the classification question is resolved.

Thank you for your consideration of our views.

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Appendix F

SUMMARIES OF WRITTEN VIEWS OF NONGOVERNMENT INTERESTED PARTIES

The following submissions are presented in HS heading/subheading order:

Warner-Lambert Company.--In a letter dated February 18, 1993, Mr. Thomas Czubak, of Warner-Lambert, requested that the Commission propose a new subheading 1704.90.20 in order to maintain existing tariff treatment of medicated cough drops containing at least 5 mg/dose of flavoring agents (e.g., menthol) as the only active antitussive ingredient. Prior to the HSC's decision that these products were classifiable in heading 1704, the U.S. Customs Service had been classifying them as medicaments in subheading 3004.90.30, in accordance with regulations of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

Joseph E. Seagram & Sons, Inc. (Seagram).--Comments dated June 18, 1993 were submitted by the law firm of Ross & Hardies (New York, NY), representing the views of this company. Seagram pointed out that the CCC's deletion of subheading 2208.10-HTS subheadings 2208.10.30, 2208.10.60 and 2208.10.90, covering compound alcoholic preparations of a kind used for the manufacture of beverages--would not result in the transfer of all such products to heading 3302, which covers only such products based on odoriferous substances. According to Seagram, those alcoholic preparations not based on odoriferous substances probably would fall to be classified in heading 2207 or 2106, and the tariff structure of subheadings 2208.10.30, 2208.10.60 and 2208.10.90 should replicated in the alternate heading(s) in order to keep the transfer rate neutral.

Sandoz Pharmaceuticals Corporation.--Comments dated July 7, 1993 were submitted by the law firm of Freeman, Wasserman & Schneider (New York, NY), on behalf of Sandoz. According to the submission, the most-favored-nation duty rate (3.7 percent ad valorem) accompanying the Commission's proposed new subheading 2939.62.00 (Ergotamine and its salts) does not reflect a 1965 Customs ruling classifying these products under a provision of the former Tariff Schedules of the United States (TSUS), which had a most-favored-nation duty rate of 1.8 percent ad valorem.

Abbot Laboratories.--In a written submission dated July 7, 1993, Abbott expressed the general concern that the Commission's proposed HTS modifications not interfere with the current GATT Uruguay Round multilateral trade negotiations, especially with respect to pharmaceutical products.¹

EM Science Division of EM Industries, Inc. (EM).--Comments dated July 6, 1993, were submitted by the law firm of Freeman, Wasserman & Schneider (New York, NY) on behalf of EM, an importer of pH and various other indicator strips designed to change color in the presence of certain ions in solution. EM's indicator strips comprise rectangular or square pads of matted cotton linters, impregnated with a chemically-reactive dye and mounted on a strip of

plastics. According to the submission, Customs currently classifies these products in HTS subheading 4823.90.35, with an MFN duty rate of 5.3% ad valorem, but EM has protested this classification and is attempting to get Customs to reclassify these products under subheading 4823.90.10, with an MFN rate of Free. Under the Commission's proposals, these products would be transferred to subheading 3822.00.50, with an MFN duty rate of 5% ad valorem. EM therefore proposed that their indicator strips be provided for in a separate tariff line under heading 3822, with an MFN rate of "Free."

Miles, Inc.--Comments dated July 8, 1993, were submitted by the law firm of Barnes, Richardson & Colburn (Chicago, IL) on behalf of Miles, a U.S. manufacturer, importer, and exporter of diagnostic reagents. In the submission, Miles supported the Commission's proposed HTS modifications relating to these products, but suggested further modifications. Specifically, Miles sought a definition of the term "prepared" for the purposes of heading 3822; a separate tariff line covering bulk "prepared reagents" without a backing or with a backing in rolls or sheets; and an exclusionary note in chapter 48 that directs classification of diagnostic reagents on a paper backing to heading 3822.

Jewelpak et al.--Comments dated March 9, 1993 were submitted by the law firm of Fitch, King and Caffentzis (New York, NY), on behalf of four importers--Jewelpak Corporation; Gerald Fried Displays, Inc.; Kalencom, Inc.; and Rich City Packaging Corp.--of certain point-of-purchase jewelry display boxes, made essentially of wood, metal, or plastics and covered with textile materials or sheeting of plastics. The submission outlined a chronology of U.S. Customs treatment of these boxes from 1987 to the present. Jewelpak et al. requested that the Commission propose new subheadings under heading 4202 to reflect (1) an HSC decision that would effect a transfer of these jewelry boxes to subheading 4202.92 from various other HTS subheadings² and (2) the duty rates applied to these products by Customs before the HSC decision and for some time after the HSC decision. According to Jewelpak et al., Customs had only recently revoked previous rulings that had classified these products outside subheading 4202.92, and the effect of that revocation was a substantial increase in the duty rate applicable.

In a posthearing brief (not dated, but received by the Commission on June 23, 1993), Messrs. Fitch and Caffentzis stated that Customs acted improperly in conforming to the HSC classification decision by revoking its previous rulings (and consequently raising the applicable duty rate), rather than directly approaching the Commission to request HTS modifications under section 1205. They stated further that the duty rates applicable at the time of the HSC decision (and before Customs' revocation of its prior rulings), should be carried over in a section 1205 action. They cited a previous 1205 action in

which the duty rates for calcium-fortified frozen concentrated orange juice were transferred from one heading to the another at the specific request of Customs to conform U.S. classification to an HSC decision that did not involve an amendment to the HS nomenclature.

Counsel also responded in its posthearing brief to issues raised in the Commission's hearing. First, it had been indicated by Commission staff that it was clearly within Customs' purview to reverse longstanding tariff classification practice, without regard to section 1205. In their brief, counsel agreed that, when Customs reverses such practice for reasons not based upon HSC action, section 1205 is not within reach of the importer for seeking relief. However, they argued, "where the basis for the [reversal] lie[s] within the four corners of HSC action, relief under Section 1205 is clearly available, and has been granted in the past." Second, counsel reiterated that the CIT could address only tariff classification -- and not applicable duty rates -- so action before that body would not be useful in this case. Third, counsel rebutted domestic producers' hearing testimony by pointing out that the domestic industry had competed successfully against foreign producers for at least 20 years under the duty rate regime that existed before Customs' ruling that reclassified the products in question in heading 4202. Finally, with regard to advantageous and "improper" assistance from foreign governments, counsel pointed out that the U.S. producers had a myriad of statutes in the U.S. Code, under which to seek relief.

International Packaging Corp. and Fuller Box Co.--Joint prehearing comments dated June 8, 1993 were submitted by the law firm of Adduci, Mastriani, Schaumberg & Schill (New York, NY) on behalf of these domestic producers of point-of-purchase jewelry presentation boxes. According to the submission, the present Customs practice of classifying these products in heading 4202, with a most-favored-nation duty rate of 20 percent ad valorem, is correct, and past Customs treatment of imports of these boxes is not germane. The submission's conclusion is that the Commission's proposed modifications concerning these products should be deleted.

In a posthearing brief dated June 23, 1993, counsel addressed each of the criteria listed in subsection 1205(a) of the Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act of 1988, concerning justification for Commission proposals to amend the HTS. Counsel argued that none of these criteria were met in the instant case and that the Commission's proposals are unnecessary and improper. In addition, counsel argued that past Customs practice concerning these products had been inconsistent and that certain of the jewelry boxes in question previously had been misclassified under the U.S. tariff.

The posthearing submission also addressed subsection 1205(d) of the 1988 Act, concerning the conditions applicable to those HTS modifications that are proposed by the Commission. In particular, counsel gave detailed arguments to support their contention that the Commission's proposals "would create a complex, contradictory scheme of classification which is inconsistent with sound nomenclature principles...." Further, counsel argued that the Commission's proposals in this respect would violate the condition that HTS

modifications "must not alter existing conditions of competition for the affected United States industry, labor, or trade." The submission cited a 500-percent increase in imports from China in the past 5 years, which has resulted in lost sales and which may lead to lost U.S. employment.

Finally, counsel pointed out that the Commission's proposals would result in a substantial loss of Customs revenue and that two Congressional bills³ introduced in 1992, which attempted to create new subheadings similar to those in the Commission's proposal, had not passed.

Luggage and Leather Goods Manufacturers of America, Inc.--In comments dated June 23, 1993, this trade association pointed out the discrepancy between the Commission's proposed modifications regarding point-of-purchase jewelry presentation boxes and certain related actions recently announced by Customs regarding the statistical treatment of these articles for quota purposes. In particular, the association stated that the expression "jewelry boxes" must be strictly defined for the purposes of any modifications to heading 4202 in order to prevent a shift in tariff treatment for more elaborate home-furnishing type jewelry boxes and travel jewelry cases, which have always been covered by heading 4202. The association further warned that statistical data on jewelry boxes could be distorted by the lack of such a definition.

Fashion Accessories Shippers Association, Inc.--Comments dated June 24, 1993, were submitted by the law firm of Serko & Simon (New York, NY) on behalf of this association. According to counsel, the text of 4202 would preclude the classification of jewelry boxes with an outer surface of metal, of wood, or of plastics in that heading because such boxes would not be "of leather or of composition leather, of plastics sheeting, of textile materials, of vulcanized fiber, or of paperboard, or wholly or mainly covered with such materials:" (text excerpted from heading 4202; emphasis added by counsel).

Russell Stadelman, Inc.--Comments dated July 12, 1993 were submitted by the law firm of Sandler, Travis & Rosenberg (New York, NY) on behalf of Stadelman, an importer of plywood and other wood products of HTS chapter 44. According to the submission, proposed new subheading note 1 to chapter 44 was unclear with respect to the term "virola," which Stadelman felt should be clarified to include white virola. The submission also pointed out certain problems with the GSP duty treatment for proposed new subheading 4412.11.30.

Association of the Nonwoven Fabrics Industry (INDA).--According to a submission dated June 23, 1993, INDA, in principle, did not oppose the Commission's proposals concerning HTS heading 5603. However, the association stated that it would be preferable to subdivide the heading on a "process" orientation rather than on a "fiber" orientation. Specifically, whereas the HSC subdivided heading 5603 into two main categories, "of man-made filament"

and "other," INDA stated that industry preference would be to replace "of man-made filament" by "of technologies which incorporate man-made filament."

Junior Gallery, Ltd.--Comments dated June 22, 1993, were submitted by the law firm of Barnes, Richardson & Colburn (New York, NY) on behalf of Junior gallery, an importer of wearing apparel. According to the submission, the description of "piping" in the context of "suits" in new note 3 to HS chapters 61 and 62 is "unacceptably vague." Counsel point out that the note restricts piping to being "of a different fabric" when, in fact, piping might also be of a nonfabric material, such as leather or suede, and of a different color.

<u>Sigvaris</u>, <u>Inc</u>.--Letters dated February 17, 1993, and May 13, 1993, were submitted by the law firm of Adduci, Mastriani, Schaumberg & Schill (New York, NY) on behalf of Sigvaris, an importer of surgical hosiery products with graduated compression for orthopedic treatment, classifiable in HTS heading 6115. The letters requested that the Commission propose certain technical rectifications to HTS modifications already proclaimed by the President.⁴

American Ski Federation (ASF).--In comments dated July 7, 1993, ASF indicated its opposition to certain of the Commission's proposals with respect to snowboard boots in HTS chapter 64. According to the submission, Customs classification of snowboard boots has changed substantially in the past few years to reach its current treatment. The Federation disagreed with the current Customs classification of certain of these boots as "protective" footwear, rather than as ski boots. The submission also contained attached comments by Item International/Airwalk and Rossignol Ski Company Incorporated concerning the similarities between downhill ski boots and snowboard boots. In late follow-up comments, dated July 30, 1993, ASF reiterated its position that, for tariff purposes, Customs should treat snowboard boots in the same manner as alpine ski boots.

Hitachi America, Ltd.--In a written submission dated July 1, 1993, Hitachi expressed concern over the increased administrative burden that will result from the implementation of the proposed HTS modifications. For example, the company indicated that the classification of computer components of heading 8471 (e.g., keyboards) will vary depending on whether they are imported separately or as part of a computer system. The company was particularly concerned with having sufficient lead time to reprogram computer data bases before implementation. The submission also sought clarification of certain proposed modifications concerning steam turbines (heading 8406), etching machines for processing semiconductor wafers (heading 8456), and note 1 to chapter 90.

<u>Panasonic Company</u>.--In a written submission dated July 9, 1993, Panasonic opined that the Commission's proposal concerning line telephone sets with cordless handsets (new subheading 8517.11.00) included duty rates that did not

reflect current Customs practice. The Commission's original proposal used duty rates taken from existing subheading 8517.10.00; Panasonic indicated that such rates should have come from subheading 8525.20.50.

AT&T.--In a written submission dated July 13, 1993, AT&T asserted that, in the Commission's proposed modifications regarding spent batteries in heading 8548, there was a probable overlap between "waste and scrap" of batteries and "spent" batteries. AT&T recommended that no such distinction be made in the HTS and that all "spent" batteries be considered "waste and scrap" for tariff purposes, in keeping with current Customs practice. The submission also suggested that the duty rates for proposed subheading 8517.11.00 be adjusted to reflect current Customs practice.

Canon U.S.A., Inc.--Comments dated June 23, 1993 were submitted by the law firm of Dorsey & Whitney (Washington, DC) on behalf of Canon U.S.A., Inc. According to the submission, Dorsey & Whitney had filed a civil action in the U.S. Court of International Trade concerning a U.S. Customs' ruling that classified these cameras in subheading 9013.80.60, with a most-favored-nation duty rate of 9 percent ad valorem. The submission further stated that a settlement was pending that would result in classification of these cameras in present HTS subheading 8525.30.00, with a most-favored-nation duty rate of 4.2 percent ad valorem. In Canon's view, the Commission's tentative proposal to apply the 9 percent duty rate to a new subheading 8525.40.40, covering still image video cameras, would be contrary to the aforementioned pending settlement.

American Association of Exporters and Importers (AAEI).--In a submission dated July 14, 1993, AAEI opined that interested parties were not allowed enough time to give full consideration to the Commission's proposed HTS modifications. AAEI further asserted that the public should be notified of HSC deliberations and decisions as they occur to allow for public input. AAEI acknowledged that HSC and related CCC documentation is available for public inspection at the Commission, but opined that such documents should be indexed by subject matter and made "more widely available to the public."

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Appendix G
HEARING TESTIMONY

The hearing for this investigation was held at the Commission on June 15, 1993. All testimony given was either in support of, or in opposition to, the Commission's proposed modifications to HTS subheading 4202.92 with respect to point-of-purchase jewelry presentation boxes.

Congressman Ronald Machtley (Rhode Island) appeared in support of U.S. producers of the subject jewelry boxes; several such producers are located in Rhode Island. In his testimony, the Congressman stressed the importance of the current 20-percent ad valorem duty rate applicable to these boxes in making the domestic industry more competitive, especially with China and other Pacific Rim countries where labor costs reportedly are far lower than in the United States. He further testified that there is no justification for the effective reversal--which would result from the Commission's proposed HTS modifications--of the latest Customs ruling to classify these products in heading 4202, with a 20-percent duty rate.

International Packaging Corp. and Fuller Box Co.--Messrs. John Kilmartin (International Packaging) and Peter Fuller (Fuller Box) gave joint testimony concerning the competitive conditions facing U.S. producers of point-of-purchase jewelry presentation boxes. They testified that producers in China and in other countries have the advantage of relatively cheap labor costs and of protective tariffs that make it difficult for U.S. producers to export to their markets.² Mr. Ralph Sheppard, of counsel, opined during Commission questioning that, under section 1205, HTS modifications perhaps should not be proposed unless they reflect changes in the international HS nomenclature;³ in the case of jewelry boxes, only the HS Explanatory Notes, which are not a legal part of the HS nomenclature, have not been changed.

Jewelpak et al.--Messrs. Peter Fitch and James Caffentzis, of the law firm of Fitch, King and Caffentzis (New York), testified on behalf of certain U.S. importers of point-of-purchase jewelry presentation boxes. In their view, the duty rates presented in the Commission's proposed HTS modifications (as of May 14, 1993) are those that existed before, until, and more than a year after the HSC decided that such boxes were classifiable in heading 4202. Mr. Fitch testified that it was only after the HS Explanatory Note to heading 4202 was amended that Customs revoked its rulings that classified these boxes according to their constituent material in other chapters, rather than in heading 4202. During Commission questioning, Mr. Fitch opined that proposed HTS modifications under section 1205 should not be limited to those that reflect amendments to the international HS nomenclature. He further stated that uniformity between the HSC decision and the HTS should have been accomplished through section 1205, rather than through revocation of existing Customs rulings. When asked if they were considering taking the matter to the

Court of International Trade, Messrs. Fitch and Caffentzis said they had no immediate plans to do so because the CIT could look only at classification, not at specific duty rates. 6
