INITIAL DETERMINATION TERMINATING RESPONDENT LUMENS  
INTEGRATIONS INC. FROM THE INVESTIGATION BASED ON SETTLEMENT**

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge’s (“ALJ”) initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 18) granting a joint motion to terminate the investigation as to Lumens Integrations Inc. based on settlement.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** The Commission instituted this investigation on March 24, 2017, based on a complaint filed on behalf of Pathway Innovations and Technologies, Inc. (“Complainant”) of San Diego, California. 82 FR 15069-70 (March 24, 2017). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain document cameras and software for use therewith by reason of infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent No. 8,508,751. The complaint named IPEVO, Inc. of Sunnyvale, California; AVer

Information Inc. of Fremont, California; and Lumens Integrations Inc. (“Lumens”) of Fremont, California as respondents.

On October 31, 2017, Complainant and Lumens jointly moved to terminate the investigation as to Lumens based on a settlement agreement. The motion also contained a request to limit service of the confidential settlement agreement.

On November 6, 2017, the ALJ issued an ID granting the joint motion. Order No. 18. The ALJ found that the parties included confidential and public versions of the settlement agreement and that the parties represented that there are no other agreements, written or oral, express or implied concerning the subject matter of the investigation. The ALJ found that termination of the investigation is not contrary to the public interest. The ALJ also granted the moving parties’ request to limit service of the confidential version of the settlement agreement based on a showing of good cause. No petitions for review were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. Part 210).
