**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE**

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 48) extending the target date for this investigation until March 17, 2025.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On February 3, 2023, the Commission instituted this investigation based on a complaint filed by Samsung Display Co., Ltd. of the Republic of Korea. 88 FR 7463-64 (Feb. 3, 2023). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or sale within the United States after importation of certain active matrix organic light-emitting diode display panels and modules for mobile devices, and components thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 9,818,803; 10,854,683; 7,414,599; and 9,330,593. *Id.* The Commission's notice of investigation named the following respondents: Apt-Ability LLC d/b/a MobileSentry of Chantilly, Virginia; Mobile Defenders, LLC of Caledonia, Michigan; DFW Imports LLC d/b/a DFW Cellphone and Parts of Dallas, Texas; Electronics Universe, Inc. d/b/a Fixez.com of Las Vegas, Nevada and Electronics Universe, Inc. d/b/a Repairs Universe, Inc. of Las Vegas, Nevada; eTech Parts Plus LLC of Southlake, Texas; Gadgetfix Corp. of Irvine, California; Injured Gadgets, LLC of Norcross, Georgia; LCTech International Inc. d/b/a SEGMobile.com of City of Industry, California;

Parts4Cells Inc. of Houston, Texas; Phone LCD Parts LLC of Wayne, New Jersey; Parts4LCD of Wayne, New Jersey; Wholesale Gadget Parts, Inc. of Bixby, Oklahoma; Group Vertical, LLC of Grand Rapids, Michigan; Souncely Plus, LLC of Tempe, Arizona; Captain Mobile Parts, Inc. of Dallas, Texas; and Mengtor Inc. of El Monte, California. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations was also named as a party in this investigation. *Id.*

On January 9, 2024, the presiding ALJ issued an ID granting Respondents' motion for summary determination due to lack of standing. Order No. 44 (Jan. 9, 2024). Order No. 44 terminated the proceedings before the ALJ. On April 24, 2024, the Commission vacated this determination and remanded the investigation to the ALJ for further proceedings. Comm'n Notice (April 24, 2024).

On May 9, 2024, the presiding ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 48) extending the target date for this investigation until March 17, 2025. No party filed a petition for review of the subject ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The target date for completion of the investigation is set for March 17, 2025, and the deadline for issuing the final ID is November 15, 2024.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on May 29, 2024.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
