**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL  
DETERMINATION FINDING CAPTAIN MOBILE PARTS IN DEFAULT**

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 16) finding respondent Captain Mobile Parts, Inc. ("Captain Mobile Parts") in default.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** On February 3, 2023, the Commission instituted this investigation based on a complaint filed by Samsung Display Co., Ltd. ("Samsung Display") of the Republic of Korea. 88 FR 7463-64 (Feb. 3, 2023). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337 based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or sale within the United States after importation of certain active matrix organic light-emitting diode display panels and modules for mobile devices, and components thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 9,818,803; 10,854,683; 7,414,599; and 9,330,593. *Id.* The Commission's notice of investigation named numerous respondents including Captain Mobile Parts of Dallas, TX. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations was also named as a party in this investigation. *Id.*

On May 10, 2023, the presiding ALJ found respondent Captain Mobile Parts in Default.<sup>1</sup> On April 27, 2023, Respondent Captain Mobile Parts filed a Notice of Intent to Default. ID at 1. No party filed a petition for review of the subject ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Captain Mobile Parts, Inc. has been found in default.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on June 7, 2023.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
