**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION FINDING CERTAIN RESPONDENTS IN DEFAULT**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge’s (“ALJ”) initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 25) finding respondent Electronics Universe, Inc. d/b/a Fixez.com and Repairs Universe of Las Vegas, Nevada (“Electronics Universe”) and LCTech International Inc. d/b/a SEGMobile.com of City of Industry, California (“LCTech”) in default.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On February 3, 2023, the Commission instituted this investigation based on a complaint filed by Samsung Display Co., Ltd. (“Samsung Display”) of the Republic of Korea. 88 FR 7463-64 (Feb. 3, 2023). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337 based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or sale within the United States after importation of certain active matrix organic light-emitting diode display panels and modules for mobile devices, and components thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 9,818,803; 10,854,683; 7,414,599; and 9,330,593. *Id.* The Commission’s notice of investigation named numerous respondents, including Electronics Universe and LCTech. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations was also named as a party in this investigation. *Id.* The complaint also alleges the existence of a domestic industry. *Id.*

On July 19, 2023, Electronics Universe filed a notice of intent to default. On July 14, 2023, LCTech also filed a notice of intent to default. On July 19, 2023, the presiding ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 25) finding Electronics Universe and LCTech in default, and that they have waived their right to appear, to be served with documents, and to contest the allegations at issue in this investigation. Order No. 25 at 2 (July 19, 2023) (citing 19 CFR 210.16(b)(4)).

No party filed a petition for review of the subject ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Respondents Electronics Universe and LCTech are hereby found in default.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on August 17, 2023.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
