**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION GRANTING A MOTION FOR TERMINATION AS TO
RESPONDENT MOSAIC BRANDS, INC.**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 16) issued by the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) granting an unopposed motion for termination as to Respondent Mosaic Brands, Inc. (“Mosaic”) based on settlement.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On March 15, 2023, the Commission instituted this investigation, based on a complaint filed by The Ridge Wallet, LLC of Santa Monica, California (“Ridge”). 88 FR 16030-031 (Mar. 15, 2023). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges that the respondents have violated section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, in the importation into the United States, sale for importation, or sale in the United States after importation of certain compact wallets and components thereof by way of infringing Ridge’s U.S. Patent No. 10,791,808. *Id.* The Commission’s notice of investigation names Rosemar Enterprises LLC d/b/a RossM Wallet of Palm Springs, California (“RossM”); INSGG of Hangzhou City, Zhejiang Province, China; Mosaic of Alamo, California; Shenzhen Swztech Co., Ltd. d/b/a SWZA of Shenzhen, Guangdong, China; and Shenzhen Pinan Technology Co., Ltd. d/b/a ARW-Wallet of Shenzhen, Guangdong, China as respondents. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is also participating in this investigation. The complaint alleges a domestic industry exists. *Id.* Respondents RossM and INSGG have been found in default. *See* Order No. 12 (Jul. 11, 2023), *unreviewed* by Comm’n Notice (Jul. 28, 2023).

On August 21, 2023, Complainant Ridge filed an unopposed motion for termination as to Respondent Mosaic based on settlement. Ridge provided both confidential and public versions of the settlement agreement as required by the Commission Rules.

On September 6, 2023, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 16) granting Ridge's unopposed motion for termination as to Respondent Mosaic based on settlement. The ID finds the motion complies with the Commission Rules and "termination of this investigation as to Mosaic by settlement will not adversely affect the public interest." ID at 1-2. No party filed a petition for review of the subject ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Respondent Mosaic is hereby terminated from the investigation.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on September 22, 2023.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
