**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL  
DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE**

**AGENCY:** U.S. International Trade Commission.

**ACTION:** Notice.

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 35) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) extending the target date to May 13, 2025.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** On October 11, 2023, the Commission instituted this investigation under Section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337 (“section 337”), based on a complaint filed by InterDigital, Inc., InterDigital VC Holdings and InterDigital Patent Holdings, Inc., of Wilmington, Delaware; and InterDigital Madison Patent Holdings SAS of Paris, France (collectively, “InterDigital”). 88 FR 70425-26 (Oct. 11, 2023). The complaint, as supplemented, alleged violations of section 337 based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain electronic devices, including smartphones, computers, tablet computers, and components thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 10,250,877; 8,674,859; 9,674,556; 9,173,054; and 8,737,933. *Id.* The complaint further alleged that an industry in the United States exists, or is in the process of being established, as required by the applicable Federal Statute. *Id.*

The notice of investigation named as respondents Lenovo Group Limited of Hong Kong SAR; Lenovo (United States) Inc. of Morrisville, North Carolina; and Motorola Mobility LLC of Chicago, Illinois (collectively, “Respondents”). *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations (“OUII”) was named as a party to the investigation. *Id.*

On January 7, 2024, the Commission terminated the investigation as to Lenovo Group Limited as a respondent and amended the complaint and notice of investigation to add Lenovo PC HK Limited as a respondent. Order No. 16 (Dec. 18, 2023); *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (Jan. 8, 2024).

On January 7, 2024, the Commission also extended the target date of the investigation to March 21, 2025. Order No. 18 (Dec. 20, 2023); *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (Jan. 8, 2024).

On April 11, 2024, InterDigital filed a motion to amend the procedural schedule and extend the target date of the investigation from March 21, 2025, to May 13, 2025.

On April 16, 2024, Respondents filed an opposition to InterDigital’s motion and a cross-motion to extend the target date of the investigation further to June 20, 2025.

On April 19, 2024, InterDigital filed an opposition to Respondents’ cross-motion for a further extension.

On April 16, 2024, and April 22, 2024, OUII filed responses to InterDigital’s motion and Respondents’ cross-motion, respectively. OUII proposed that the week of September 30, 2024, is “an appropriate time to schedule the evidentiary hearing, if the ALJ is also available” and “otherwise amenable to whatever procedural schedule the ALJ decides works best for this investigation.” OUII’s response to Respondents’ cross-motion at 1 and 8.

On April 30, 2024, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 35) pursuant to Commission Rule 210.51, 19 CFR 210.51, granting the motion to amend the procedural schedule and extend the target date from March 21, 2025, to May 13, 2025, to accommodate additional discovery. ID at 2.

No petitions for review of the subject ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The target date is May 13, 2025, and the final ID is due on January 13, 2025.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on May 16, 2024.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
