**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE BY TWO MONTHS**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 25) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) extending the target date for completion of the above-captioned investigation to January 5, 2026.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on June 5, 2024, based on a complaint filed by SiOnyx, LLC of Beverly, Massachusetts (“SiOnyx”). *See* 89 FR 48191-48192 (June 5, 2024). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or the sale within the United States after importation of certain sensors with pixels and products containing same by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 9,064,764; 9,905,599; 10,224,359; 11,069,737; and 11,721,714. *Id.* The complaint further alleges that a domestic industry exists. *Id.* The Commission’s notice of investigation named as respondents Samsung Electronics Co., Ltd. of Suwon, Republic of Korea; Samsung Electronics America, Inc. of Ridgefield Park, New Jersey; and Samsung Semiconductor, Inc. of San Jose, California (collectively, “Samsung”). *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is not participating in the investigation. *Id.*

On September 30, 2024, SiOnyx and Samsung filed a joint motion to extend the target date of this investigation. The joint motion states more time is needed to complete the extensive discovery needed in the investigation.

On October 2, 2024, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 25) extending the target date by two months to January 5, 2026. Order No. 25 (Oct. 3, 2024). The subject ID finds that there is good cause for the extension based on the additional time needed for the parties to complete discovery. The ID states that the final ID on violation will issue no later than September 5, 2025.

No petitions for review of the ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID (Order No. 25). Accordingly, the target date is January 5, 2026, and the final initial determination is due no later than September 5, 2025.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on October 21, 2024.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
