INITIAL DETERMINATION TERMINATING THE INVESTIGATION  
AS TO THREE RESPONDENTS ON THE BASIS OF SETTLEMENT**

**ACTION:** Notice.

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 103) terminating three respondents from the above-captioned investigation on the basis of settlement.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** The Commission instituted this investigation on November 29, 2011, based on a complaint filed by Robert Bosch LLC of Farmington Hills, Michigan ("Bosch") alleging a violation of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), in the importation, the sale for importation, or the sale within the United States after importation, of certain articles that infringe certain claims of nine patents. *76 Fed. Reg.* 73677. The respondents in the investigation include Corea Autoparts Producing Corp. of Gyeongsangbuk-do, Korea; PIAA Corp. USA of Portland, Oregon; and CAP America, Inc. of

Farmington Hills, Michigan (collectively, “CAP”). *Id.* at 73678; Order No. 15 (Mar. 16, 2012) (amending notice of investigation to add CAP America, Inc.), *not reviewed*, Notice (Apr. 12, 2012).

On September 19, 2013, Bosch and CAP filed a joint motion to terminate the investigation as to CAP on the basis of settlement. On September 24, 2013, the Commission investigative attorney filed the only response, which was in support of the motion. On September 30, 2013, the ALJ granted the motion as an ID, finding termination as to CAP to be in the public interest. Order No. 103; *see* 19 C.F.R. § 210.50(b)(2).

No petitions for review of the ID were filed. The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in sections 210.21 and 210.42 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. §§ 210.21, 210.42).
