**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DECISION NOT TO REVIEW  
TWO INITIAL DETERMINATIONS TERMINATING THE INVESTIGATION  
AS TO TWO RESPONDENTS ON THE BASIS OF SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS**

**AGENCY:** U.S. International Trade Commission.

**ACTION:** Notice.

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") initial determinations ("IDs") (Order Nos. 10-11) terminating two respondents on the basis of settlement agreements.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** The Commission instituted this investigation on March 28, 2013, based on a complaint filed by Lamina Packaging Innovations LLC ("Lamina") of Longview, Texas. 78 *Fed. Reg.* 19008 (Mar. 28, 2013). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended 19 U.S.C. § 1337, by reason of the infringement of certain claims of United States Patent Nos. 6,207,242 and 7,348,067. The notice of institution named fifteen respondents, including Camus Wines & Spirits Group ("Camus") of Cognac, France, and Sidney Frank Importing Co., Inc. ("Sidney Frank") of New Rochelle, New York.

On April 15, 2013, Lamina and Camus filed a joint motion to terminate the investigation on the basis of a settlement agreement. On May 7, 2013, the ALJ granted the motion as an ID. Order No. 10. He found that the motion to terminate was based upon good cause pursuant to 19 C.F.R. § 210.21(a)(1) and that pursuant to 19 C.F.R. § 210.50(b) the public interest supported grant of the motion. Order No. 10 at 2-3.

On April 25, 2013, Lamina and Sidney Frank filed a joint motion to terminate the investigation on the basis of a settlement agreement. On May 7, 2013, the ALJ granted the motion as an ID. Order No. 11. He found that the motion to terminate was based upon good cause pursuant to 19 C.F.R. § 210.21(a)(1) and that pursuant to 19 C.F.R. § 210.50(b) the public interest supported grant of the motion. Order No. 11 at 1-2.

No petitions for review of the IDs were filed. The Commission has determined not to review the IDs.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in sections 210.21 and 210.42 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. §§ 210.21, 210.42).
