**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION TERMINATING THE INVESTIGATION AS TO SEVERAL
RESPONDENTS BASED ON A CONSENT ORDER STIPULATION AND CONSENT
ORDER; ISSUANCE OF CONSENT ORDER**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 13) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) terminating the above-captioned investigation as to respondents Print-Rite Holdings Ltd. and Innotex Precision Ltd., both of Chai Wan, Hong Kong; Print-Rite N.A., Inc. of La Vergne, Tennessee; Union Technology International (M.C.O.) Co. Ltd. of Macau, China; and Print-Rite Unicorn Image Products Co. Ltd. of Guangdong, China (collectively, the “Print-Rite respondents”) based on a consent order stipulation and consent order. The Commission has issued the consent order.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on June 12, 2014, based on a complaint filed on behalf of Canon Inc. of Tokyo, Japan; Canon U.S.A., Inc. of Melville, New York; and Canon Virginia, Inc. of Newport News, Virginia. 79 *Fed. Reg.* 33777-8. The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, by reason of infringement of certain claims of the following U.S. Patent Nos.: 8,280,278; 8,630,564; 8,682,215; 8,676,090; 8,369,744 (“the ’744 patent”); 8,565,640 (“the ’640

patent”); 8,676,085 (“the ’085 patent”); 8,135,304 (“the ’304 patent”); and 8,688,008. The complaint further alleges the existence of a domestic industry. The Commission’s notice of investigation named several respondents including the Print-Rite respondents. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations (“OUII”) is also a party to the investigation. *Id.*

On September 11, 2014, the Commission issued notice of its determination to terminate the investigation as to the ’744, ’640, ’085, and ’304 patents based on partial withdrawal of the complaint.

On September 24, 2014, complainants and the Print-Rite respondents jointly moved to terminate the investigation as to the Print-Rite respondents based on a consent order stipulation. OUII supported the motion.

The ALJ issued the subject ID on October 9, 2014, granting the joint motion for termination as to the Print-Rite respondents. The ALJ found that the consent order stipulation and consent order satisfy the requirements of Commission rule 210.21(c). He further found, pursuant to Commission rule 210.50(b)(2), there is no indication that termination of this investigation as to the Print-Rite respondents based on the consent order stipulation would adversely impact the public interest. No party petitioned for review of the ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the ID and has issued the consent order.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, 19 C.F.R. Part 210.
