**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION GRANTING COMPLAINANTS' UNOPPOSED MOTION TO
PARTIALLY TERMINATE THE INVESTIGATION AS TO CERTAIN CLAIMS
BASED UPON WITHDRAWAL OF ALLEGATIONS PERTAINING TO THOSE
CLAIMS FROM THE COMPLAINT**

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 42) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) granting an unopposed motion to partially terminate the investigation as to claims 1, 5, 7, 16, and 17 of U.S. Patent No. 8,529,811 (“the ’811 patent”), based upon withdrawal of allegations pertaining to those claims from the complaint.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted Inv. No. 337-TA-963 on August 21, 2015, based on a complaint filed by AliphCom d/b/a Jawbone of San Francisco, California and BodyMedia, Inc. of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania (collectively, “Jawbone”). 80 *Fed. Reg.* 50870-71 (Aug. 21, 2015). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain activity tracking devices, systems, and components thereof by reason of infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent No. 8,073,707; U.S. Patent No. 8,398,546; U.S. Patent No. 8,793,522; U.S. Patent

No. 8,446,275; U.S. Patent No. 8,961,413; and the '811 patent. The complaint further alleges misappropriation of trade secrets, the threat or effect of which is to destroy or substantially injure an industry in the United States. The notice of investigation named the following respondents: Fitbit, Inc. of San Francisco, California; Flextronics International Ltd. of San Jose, California; and Flextronics Sales & Marketing (A-P) Ltd. of Port Louis, Mauritius (collectively, "Respondents"). The Office of Unfair Import Investigations (OUII) is a party to the investigation.

On March 8, 2016, Jawbone moved to terminate the investigation as to the remaining claims of the '811 patent, claims 1, 5, 7, 16, and 17. The ALJ previously granted Jawbone's motion to terminate the investigation as to claim 6 of the '811 patent, and the Commission determined not to review. *See* Order No. 32 (Feb. 22, 2016); Commission Notice of Non-Review (Mar. 21, 2016). Jawbone indicated that Respondents and OUII do not oppose the motion.

On March 11, 2016, the ALJ issued the subject ID, granting the unopposed motion. The ALJ found that the motion complied with the requirements of Commission Rule 210.21(a)(1) (19 C.F.R. § 210.21(a)(1)) and further found that no extraordinary circumstances prohibited granting the motion. None of the parties petitioned for review of the ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. Part 210).
