SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined to grant a request by the presiding administrative law judge (ALJ) for judicial enforcement of subpoenas issued in this investigation and has authorized its Office of the General Counsel to seek such enforcement, if necessary.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on August 24, 2015, based on a complaint filed by Trico Products Corporation of Rochester Hills, Michigan ("Trico"). 80 *Fed. Reg.* 51308-09 (Aug. 24, 2015). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain windscreen wipers and components thereof by reason of infringement of certain claims of United States Patent Nos. 6,836,925 and 6,799,348. The notice of investigation named the following respondents: Valeo North America, Inc. of Troy, Michigan and Delmex de Juarez S.

De R.L. de C.V. of Chihuahua, Mexico (collectively, “Valeo”). The Office of Unfair Import Investigations (OUII) is not a party to the investigation.

On March 3, 2016, Valeo moved to obtain judicial enforcement of subpoenas *duces tecum* (“subpoenas”) that were issued on January 21, 2016, to non-parties Crowne Group Holdings, LLC (“Crowne”) and KTRI Holdings, Inc. (“KTRI”). On March 10, 2016, Crowne and KTRI filed a combined opposition to Valeo’s motion. The ALJ granted Valeo’s motion on March 24, 2016, in Order No. 16, and certified a request for judicial enforcement of the subpoenas to the Commission. The Commission has determined to grant the ALJ’s request and has authorized its Office of the General Counsel to seek judicial enforcement of the subpoena, if necessary.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and Commission Rule of Practice and Procedure 210.32(g), 19 C.F.R. § 210.32(g).
