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Highlights

The following are highlights of the economic data collected on the heavyweight motorcycle industry for the first quarter of 1987, compared with data collected for the first quarter of 1986. Since most data obtained by the Commission-regarding-the-domestic heavyweight-motorcycle-industry-are-business confidential (even in the aggregate), little information concerning the domestic industry is available in the public report.

- o U.S. production of heavyweight motorcycles decreased by 6.2 percent, to 22,153 units during January-March 1987, from 23,627 units during January-March 1986 (table 1). U.S. producers' shipments of heavyweight motorcyles increased by 5.4 percent, from 20,902 units during January-March 1986, to 22,029 units during January-March 1987. Producers' and dealers' inventories decreased during January-March 1987 compared with the corresponding period of 1986, while producers' retail sales and exports increased.
- o The average unit net selling price for U.S.—produced heavyweight motorcycles decreased from \$4,661 during January—March 1986, to \$4,650 during January—March 1987.
- o Total employment decreased by 2.5 percent, from 2,965 workers as of March 1986 to 2,929 workers as of March 1987, and total hours worked by production and related workers decreased from 382,000 hours as of March 1986 to 319,000 hours as of March 1987.
- o U.S. imports of heavyweight motorcycles decreased by 41.1 percent, to 10,669 units in the first quarter of 1987 compared with 18,112 units in the first quarter of 1986.
- O U.S. shipments of imported heavyweight motorcycles declined by 31.9 percent, from 20,689 units in January-March 1986 to 14,099 units in January-March 1987 (table 2).
- o U.S. importers' retail sales of imported heavyweight motorcycles decreased by 54.0 percent, from 14,662 units in January-March 1986 to 6,739 units in January-March 1987 (table 3).
- o Combined importers' and dealers' inventories of imported heavyweight motorcycles decreased by 44.7 percent, from 87,795 units as of March 31, 1986, to 48,567 units as of March 31, 1987 (tables 4 and 5).
