**NOTICE OF THE COMMISSION'S ADOPTION OF  
AN INITIAL DETERMINATION SETTING THE TARGET DATE  
AT EIGHTEEN MONTHS**

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has adopted an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 4) of the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ") setting the target date for completion of the investigation at eighteen months.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** On April 18, 2025, the Commission instituted this investigation based on a complaint filed by Credo Semiconductor Inc. of San Jose, California and Credo Technology Group Ltd. of the Cayman Islands. 90 FR 16,551 (Apr. 18, 2025). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain active electrical cables and components thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 10,877,233; 11,012,252; and 11,032,111. *Id.* The Commission's notice of investigation named the following respondents: Amphenol Corporation of Wallingford, Connecticut; Molex, LLC of Lisle, Illinois; and TE Connectivity PLC of Galway, Ireland. *Id.* at 16,552. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is a party to this investigation. *Id.*

On May 5, 2025, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 4) pursuant to Commission Rule 210.51(a)(1), 19 CFR 210.51(a)(1). The ID explains that good cause exists for the eighteen-month target date, including "the number of asserted claims, the other investigations

currently assigned to [the ALJ], and staffing shortages within the Office of Administrative Law Judges.” Order No. 4 at 2.

No petitions for Commission review of the ID were filed.

The Commission has adopted the subject ID pursuant to Commission Rule 210.42(c)(1) & (h)(3), 19 CFR 210.42(c)(1) & (h)(3).

The Commission vote for this determination took place on June 18, 2025.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
