**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION SETTING THE TARGET DATE OF THE INVESTIGATION**

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 6) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) setting the target date for completion of the above-captioned investigation as October 3, 2026.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on May 19, 2025, based on a complaint filed by Nokia Technologies Oy and Nokia Corporation, both of Espoo, Finland. 90 FR 21335-36 (May 19, 2025). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337 (“section 337”), based on the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain video-capable laptop, desktop computers, handheld computers, tablets, televisions, projectors, and components and modules thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 9,036,701; 10,536,714; 11,805,267; and 8,050,321. *Id.* The complaint further alleges that a domestic industry exists. *Id.* The notice of investigation names the following respondents: Acer America Corporation of San Jose, California; Acer Inc. of Xizhi, Taiwan; ASUSTeK Computer Inc. of Taipei City, Taiwan; ASUS

Computer International of Fremont, California; Hisense Co., Ltd. of Qingdao, China; Hisense USA Corporation of Suwanee, Georgia; and Hisense Electronics Manufacturing Company of America Corporation of Suwanee, Georgia. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is also named as a party. *Id.*

On June 2, 2025, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 6) setting the target date of the investigation pursuant to Commission Rule 210.51(a), 19 CFR 210.51(a), as October 3, 2026.

No petitions for review of the ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the ID. The investigation's target date is October 3, 2026.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on June 18, 2025.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
